15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel (Mt. 13, 1-23) we hear of the parable of the sower and the many ways of receiving the seed, the Word of God. In the parable, Jesus is the Sower; the Seed, the Word of God or His teachings. The soil symbolizes the various types of people who hear and give responses to God's word. And so it is that there are those who receive it without depth (the seed on the path). There are those who receive it without fruits (the seed sown on rocky ground and among thorns). And finally, there are those who receive it with fruits (the seed on good soil).

The question that we should ask ourselves is this: How many of us are truly living the Word of God in our lives? We oftentimes forget that The Bible is there for us to read, listen to what God is trying to speak to us and to act it out and live it. The Bible is not just part of the decor in our homes displayed on one of our shelves or even on our altar. It is meant to be read, reflected upon and lived out. That is what God wants of us. If we can afford to waste our time in shopping malls or even in front of our TVs, laptops, tablets and gadgets, we hope that we could also spend time reading the Bible and reflecting upon God's words. This pandemic time is our opportunity to have time to read the Word of God, ponder on what God is saying to us and practice what we have learned and reflected from His words.

We can also listen to the Word of God every time we celebrate the Eucharist. Our Church has reopened and God is inviting us to partake in His Word and in His Body in the Eucharist. Let us listen attentively in the Mass where our God speaks to us. Let us receive Him in the Eucharist as our response to live His words in our lives. In this way, we become the good soil. The good soil that is attentively listening to God and wholeheartedly responding to God's word in day-to-day living.

The Word of God is the seed being planted in us, in our hearts. We must not only hear it. We must know it by heart. We must understand it and much more live it. After all, God's word should not end only in listening but also in living. The Sower, our God, is generous to sow His words in our hearts. May we listen to God's word, receive it in our hearts and generously live it in our lives.



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On July 2, 2020 Governor Newsom's Office issued a new order concerning singing and chanting in "Places of Worship" effective immediately.

This order also applies to priests, deacons, and cantors. Other than this one change, indoor Masses that comply with the current diocesan regulations are still permitted.

Places of worship must therefore discontinue singing and chanting activities and limit indoor attendance to 25% of building capacity or a maximum of 100 attendees, whichever is lower. Local Health Officers are advised to consider appropriate limitations on outdoor attendance capacities, factoring their jurisdiction's key COVID- 19 health indicators.

Places of worship must comply with all Cal/OSHA standards and be prepared to adhere to its guidance as well as guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH).

With mass attendance down due to the Coronavirus, we ask that you consider signing up for Electronic Fund Transfer so that we can keep the parish up and running during this difficult time. EFT is a safe, convenient way to give to the parish even when you are unable to attend mass or you are away on vacation. Reservations will close on Saturdays at 12 noon and then reopen on Monday at 9 am for the next weekend.

15º domingo del tiempo ordinario

En el Evangelio de hoy (Mt. 13, 1-23) escuchamos sobre la parábola del sembrador y las muchas formas de recibir la semilla, la Palabra de Dios. En la parábola, Jesús es el sembrador; La Semilla, la Palabra de Dios o Sus enseñanzas. El suelo simboliza los diversos tipos de personas que escuchan y dan respuestas a la palabra de Dios. Y así es que hay quienes lo reciben sin profundidad (la semilla en el camino). Hay quienes lo reciben sin frutos (la semilla sembrada en suelo rocoso y entre espinas). Y finalmente, hay quienes lo reciben con frutos (la semilla en buena tierra).

La pregunta que debemos hacernos es esta: ¿Cuántos de nosotros estamos realmente viviendo la Palabra de Dios en nuestras vidas? Muchas veces olvidamos que la Biblia está ahí para que la leamos, escuchemos lo que Dios está tratando de hablarnos y para representarlo y vivirlo. La Biblia no es solo parte de la decoración de nuestros hogares que se muestra en uno de nuestros estantes o incluso en nuestro altar. Está destinado a ser leído, reflexionado y vivido es lo que Dios quiere de nosotros. Si podemos permitirnos perder el tiempo en centros comerciales o incluso frente a nuestros televisores, computadoras portátiles, tabletas y dispositivos, esperamos que también podamos pasar tiempo leyendo la Biblia y reflexionando sobre las palabras de Dios. La Familia del Buen Pastor se complace en informarles que reabriremos la parroquia a partir del 1 de julio para las Misas en el Templo siguiendo las pautas de capacidad limitada del Condado de Contra Costa: **No más de 100 personas por misa.** Para garantizar que no superemos la capacidad de 100 personas y que nos mantengamos seguros, le solicitamos que siga las siguientes instrucciones:

1- Registrese para obtener una boleta de entrada

- Ir a nuestro sitio web: www.goodshepherdpittsburgh.org para inscribirse y obtener la boleta de entrada
- O envíe un correo electrónico: yvette@goodshepherdpittsburgh.org
- O llame a la oficina parroquial 925-432-6404 para obtenerla

2- Cuando venga a la parroquia

- Use una máscara todo el tiempo (Su máscara debe cubrir la boca y la nariz).
- Llegue por lo menos con 15 minutos de anticipación a la Misa.
- Muestre su boleta a uno de los ministros de bienvenida.
- Desinfectante de manos estará disponible a la entrada, pero le recomendamos que traiga su propio desinfectante.

3- Mantenga su distancia

- Siéntese sólo en las bancas indicadas.
- Las familias pueden sentarse juntas.
- Mantenga una distancia segura con los demás.
- Solo una persona puede utilizar el baño a la vez.

4- Al participar en la Misa cuide su seguridad y la de los demás

- No se facilitarán los misales en las bancas. Puede seguir las lecturas en su teléfono, pero manteniéndolo en silencio.
- Siga las instrucciones de los ministros que dirigen la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión.
- Mantenga la distancia social en la línea para recibir la Sagrada Comunión.
- Reciba la Sagrada Comunión en la mano.
- Cuando termine la Misa, salga por las puertas delanteras.

WELCOME BACK TO GOOD SHEPHERD CHURCH FOR SUNDAY MASSES

The Family of Good Shepherd is excited to advise you that we will reopen the church on July 1st for public worship following limited capacity guidelines of Contra Costa County: **No more than 100 people per Mass.**

To ensure we do not exceed the 100 person capacity and to keep each other safe, we ask you to consult these following instructions:

1- Sign Up for Tickets

- Go to our website: www.goodshepherdpittsburg.org to sign up for tickets
- Or email: yvette@goodshepherdpittsburg.org
- or call parish office 925-432-6404 to get them.

2- Come to the Church

- Wear a mask at all times (Your mask must cover your mouth and your nose).
- Come at least 15 minutes before the Mass begins.
- Show your ticket to an usher as you enter.
- Hand sanitizer will be available upon entrance, but we recommend you bring your own sanitizer.

3- Keep Your Distance

- Sit only in the indicated pews.
- Families may sit together.
- Maintain a safe distance from all others.
- One person uses the restroom at a time.

4- Participate Safely in the Mass

- No worship aids will be provided. You can follow the readings on your phone, but keep it silent.
- Follow ushers' directions for Communion. Maintain social distances in the Communion line.
- Receive Communion in the hand.
- Leave the Church through front side doors.
