The Gospel tells us that God freely forgives. He is always willing and ready to forgive us. God forgives without limit, without condition, and without hesitation. Jesus said to Peter, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." What he means by telling Peter this is to forgive to the utmost of his capacity to forgive. We must forgive without limit because God's forgiveness is without limit, without measure, and without end.

Obviously, it's not easy to forgive. It goes against our human nature. One indispensable attitude towards genuine forgiveness is the power of relinquishment, the ability to let go and say, "I am willing to forgive, therefore, I am willing to let go and forget." The problem is that many of us say we forgive, but we continue to carry the bitterness and resentment inside of us. Thus, we hear such remarks like, "I forgive him, but he better watch out. Don't ever let him show his face to me."

God has never refused us of his forgiveness so why should we limit our own forgiveness? God has no set conditions on forgiving. Why should we set conditions before we can forgive? Why should we not forgive? Why can we not love? Why can we not accept our erring brothers and sisters? God has forgiven us first, continuously forgives, not only once but seventy-seven times. And when God forgives, He does not punish us. He does not hold a grudge. He forgets our sins and weaknesses and welcomes us back. He does not withhold his love but continuously love us.

Sometimes we forgive our brothers and sisters in words, but harbor a grudge. We do not forget that they have sinned against us. We must admit that the forgiveness we ask from God is the same forgiveness that we withhold from our brothers and sisters who ask for our forgiveness. We must accept that the love we have been asking from God is the same love that we oftentimes refuse to share with our brothers and sisters who have wronged us.

How do we forgive then? Let us remember the prayer Jesus Himself taught us; the Our Father, which says "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespassed against us." If God forgives us, we must also forgive those who have wronged us and ask for forgiveness from those whom we have done wrong. We have sinned and we ask for God's forgiveness and that forgiveness brings us peace. Anyone who refuses to forgive will never experience the joy and peace of God's forgiveness.

We will be forgiven as we forgive those who have wronged us. We will merit God's forgiveness if we ask forgiveness from those whom we have also wronged. As God has forgiven us many times, may we also forgive those who have sinned against us and find peace and joy in our hearts.

El Evangelio nos dice que Dios nos perdona libremente. Siempre esta dispuesto a perdonar. Y Dios perdona sin limite, sin condicion, sin vacilacion. Esto es lo que Jesus le dijo a Pedro. "Les digo, no siete veces, sino setenta y siete veces". Le estaba diciendo a Pedro que perdonara al maximo de su capacidad de perdonar. Debemos perdonar sin limite porque el perdon de Dios es sin limite, sin medida y sin fin.

Obviamente, no es facil perdonar. Va en contra de nuestra naturaleza humana. Una actitud indispensable hacia el perdon genuino es el poder de la renuncia: la capacidad de dejar ir y decir: "Estoy dispuesto a perdonar, por lo tanto, estoy dispuesto a dejar ir y olvidar". El problema es que muchos de nosotros decimos que perdonamos, pero seguimos cargando con la amargura y el resentimiento dentro de nosotros. Por lo tanto, escuchamos comentarios como, "Lo perdonó, pero que tenga cuidado". Nunca dejes que me muestre su rostro".

Dios nunca nos ha negado su perdon, entonces, porque deberiamos limitar nuestro perdon? Dios no ha establecido condiciones para perdonarnos, entonces, porque deberiamos establecer condiciones antes de poder perdonar? ?Porque no perdonar? Porque no podemos amar? Porque no podemos aceptar a nuestros hermanos y hermanas descarridos? Dios nos ha perdonado primero y perdona continuamente, no solo una vez, sino setenta y siete veces. Y cuando Dios perdoná, no nos castiga. No guarda rencor. El olvida nuestros pecados y debilidades y nos da la bienvenida. El no niega su amor, sino que nos ama continuamente.

A veces perdonamos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas con palabras, pero guardamos rencor o no nos gusta olvidar lo que han pecado contra nosotros. Debemos admitir que el perdon que pedimos a Dios es el mismo perdon que retenemos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas que nos piden perdon. Debemos aceptar que el amor que le hemos estado pidiendo a Dios es el mismo amor que muchas veces nos negamos a compartir con nuestros hermanos y hermanas que nos han agraviado.

Como perdonamos entonces? Recordemos la oracion que Jesus mismo nos enseño el Padre Nuestro, que dice: "Perdonanos nuestras ofensas como nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden". Si Dios nos perdona, tambien debemos perdonar a los que nos han hecho mal y pedir perdon a aquellos a quienes hemos hecho mal. Hemos pecado y le pedimos perdon a Dios y que su perdon nos traiga paz. Cualquiera que se niegue a perdonar nunca experimentara el gozo y la paz del perdon de Dios.

Seremos perdonados como perdonamos a los que nos han hecho dano. Seremos merecedores del perdon de Dios si tambien pedimos perdon a aquellos a quienes tambien hemos agraviado. Como Dios nos ha perdonado muchas veces, que tambien perdonemos a los que han pecado contra nosotros y encontraremos paz y gozo en nuestros corazones.


