The parable of the talents we hear on this 33rd Sunday tells us that God gives each person a different amount of talents: to one he gives 5, to another 2, to another 1. Some use them and make profits; some do not use them at all. The parable reminds us that it is not our talents which matter. What matters is how we use them. God never demands from us abilities we don't have, but he does demand that we should use our abilities to the fullest. We are not equal in talent but we can be equal in effort. The man with the one talent in the gospel did not lose his talent; he simply did nothing with it. It is always a temptation for us to say, "*I have so small a talent and I can do so little with it. It is not worth to try at all.*" But God tells us that whatever talent we have, little or great, we must lay it at the service of God. If we don't use it, we will have to answer God when we see him face to face.

Talents are not just money, a high IQ, or ability to compose music, to paint beautiful pictures, or to play sports well. It is a capacity to love and to care for others. We don't need a high IQ to love someone. God doesn't care about status or popularity. He cares about our hearts and souls, and how we serve others to the best of our abilities with the gifts he has given to us. He wants us to use them for the good of others, not to just bury them or keep them to ourselves. God has a special purpose for us and if we only look deeply within ourselves, we will see that we were created specifically to be someone meaningful.

Not everyone is destined to be the president, nor a doctor or lawyer. Not everyone has the gift to be a beautiful singer, poet, or artist. But each of us can be something much greater: a Saint! All we have to do is to use what God has given to us, our unique gift, develop that gift, and then constantly share it with others. Let's be saints. What else is there? Lord, help us make good use of the talents you have given us for the good of others and for your greater glory. Amen.

La parábola de los talentos que escuchamos este treceavo Domingo nos dice que Dios le da a cada uno una cantidad diferente de talentos: a uno le da 5, a otro 2, a otro 1. Pero algunos los usan y obtienen ganancias; algunos no los usan en absoluto. La parábola nos recuerda que no son nuestros talentos los que importan; lo que importa es cómo los usamos. Dios nunca nos exige habilidades que no tenemos; pero exige que utilicemos al máximo las habilidades que tenemos. No somos iguales en talento; pero podemos ser iguales en esfuerzo. El hombre con un talento en el evangelio no perdió su talento; simplemente no hizo nada con él. Siempre es una tentación para nosotros decir: "Tengo un talento tan pequeño y puedo hacer tan poco con él. No vale la pena intentarlo en absoluto. "Pero Dios nos dice que cualquier talento que tengamos, pequeño o grande, debemos ponerlo al servicio de Dios. Si no lo usamos, tendremos que responderle a Dios cuando lo veamos cara a cara.

Los talentos aquí no son solo dinero o un alto coeficiente intelectual. o habilidad para componer música, pintar bellos cuadros o practicar deportes. Es la capacidad de amar y cuidar a los demás. No necesitamos un coeficiente intelectual alto para amar a alguien. A Dios no le importa el estatus o la popularidad. Él se preocupa por nuestros corazones y almas, y por cómo servimos a los demás lo mejor que podemos con los dones que nos ha dado. Quiere que los usemos para el bien de los demás, no solo para enterrarlos o guardarlos para nosotros. Dios tiene un propósito especial para nosotros y si solo miramos profundamente dentro de nosotros mismos, veremos que fuimos creados específicamente para ser alguien significativo.

No todo el mundo está destinado a ser presidente, ni médico o abogado. No todo el mundo tiene el don de ser un bello cantante, poeta o artista. Pero cada uno de nosotros puede ser algo mucho más grande, ¡un Santo! Todo lo que tenemos que hacer es usar lo que Dios nos ha dado, nuestro don único, desarrollar ese don y luego compartirlo constantemente con los demás. Seamos un santo. ¿Qué más hay? Señor, ayúdanos a hacer un buen uso de los talentos que nos has dado para el bien de los demás y para tu mayor gloria. Amén.

REOPENING OF OUR PARISH CHURCH

The county has determined that we can now open the church with limited capacity of 100 people for indoor services. We ask that you comply with the following procedures as we move indoors.

- ◆ Attendance at all masses requires a reservation through our website at www.goodshepherdpittsburg.org
- ◆ Our mass schedule will be as follows:
 - ⇒ Daily Mass at 7:30 am in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Saturday Mass 8 am in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Saturday Mass 5:30 pm in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass at 8am in the church -100
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass 10am and 12pm in the Spiritual Garden-Unlimited
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass at 3 pm in the Church-100
 - ⇒ ALL WEEKEND MASSES WILL BE LIVESTREAMED
- ◆ Please take the following measures when attending Mass
 - ⇒ Prior to coming to mass please take your temperature and ask yourself the following questions:
 - 1. *Have you or anyone in your household traveled domestically or internationally by air or cruise ship in the last 14 days?*
 - 2. *Do you or anyone in your household have the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, temperature over 100 degrees, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, loss of taste or smell?*
 - 3. *Have you or anyone in your household been notified of being exposed to someone with Covid 19 or respiratory illness in the last 14 days?*
 - 4. *Are you or anyone in your household currently under quarantine?*

If you answer "yes" to any of these questions PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS.

- ⇒ Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth
- ⇒ Come to Mass 15 minutes early to check in
- ⇒ Sanitizer will be available as you enter but we recommend that you bring your own
- ⇒ Follow the ushers instructions for seating- Families may sit together but maintain social distancing from all others
- ⇒ No worship aids will be provided but you may follow the Mass with your own book or on your mobile phone as long it is on silent mode.
- ⇒ Follow the ushers direction to receive Holy Communion-Please receive in the hand.
- ⇒ Follow directions when leaving the church.
- ⇒ Please, only one person at a time in the restroom.
