
The gospel parable tells us about the ten virgins waiting for the coming of the bridegroom. What does the behavior of the ten bridesmaids in the gospel reading tell us? These are the challenges that we must face and fulfill in life that we may, in the end, rejoice with the groom, our Lord Jesus Christ, in that heavenly garden, God's kingdom.

First, be ready always. Yes, we have so many concerns and worries in life. There are so many things to do in this busy world, so many deadlines to meet and tasks to accomplish. However, the only thing that we should be concerned about is our desire to be in God's kingdom and we do not know when that will happen. So as long as we have the time, we must be prepared and be ready always. Let us also remember, like the bridegroom, Jesus would come to us in unexpected time and ways.

Second, be patient and persevering. Just as the ten bridesmaids waited for the groom, in our life there is a lot of waiting to do. There is a lot of work, with sacrifices and sufferings to bear. There are many trials to face. Thus, we should persevere and be patient. In these difficult times, we all need to be patient and persevering. We should continue to hold on to our faith amid crises and pandemic, patiently waiting and persevering until all of this is over. Furthermore, with our perseverance when facing sacrifices and sufferings, in our waiting and in our work, we manifest our fidelity and faithfulness to God. With our patience with the people around us, we become charitable to them and we show our love to them.

Finally, participate in God's heavenly banquet. The wedding feast symbolizes entry into heaven. God wants us to be with him. He desires our union with him. He does everything so that we can be with him. But we must do our share. The wise virgins are not being selfish; they cannot simply give oil to the foolish ones. There are some things that cannot be done for us by others. We must do our part to cooperate in the plans God has for us. Each of us is personally responsible for our own inner life. We cannot blame anyone else if we are not able to join the groom in his wedding feast. Thus, we must do our part, participate, and cooperate with the will of God for us. And we can only participate in God's celebration of the heavenly banquet when we are always ready and prepared, when we persevere and are patient in his ways and willingly cooperate in doing His will.

When our time comes to meet the groom, our Lord Jesus Christ, we are assured that we face Him with our oil burning, the flame of our love for Him alive in our hearts, for we are ready and persevered in waiting for Him and can participate faithfully in His eternal banquet.



REOPENING OF OUR PARISH CHURCH

The county has determined that we can now open the church with limited capacity of 100 people for indoor services. We ask that you comply with the following procedures as we move indoors.

- ◆ Attendance at all masses requires a reservation through our website at www.goodshepherdpittsburg.org
 - ◆ Our mass schedule will be as follows:
 - ⇒ Daily Mass at 7:30 am in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Saturday Mass 8 am in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Saturday Mass 5:30 pm in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass at 8 am and 10 am in the Spiritual Garden-Unlimited with social distancing
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass at 12 pm in the Church-100
 - ⇒ Sunday Mass at 3 pm in the Church-100
 - ⇒ ALL WEEKEND MASSES WILL BE LIVESTREAMED
 - ◆ Please take the following measures when attending Mass
 - ⇒ Prior to coming to mass please take your temperature and ask yourself the following questions:
 1. *Have you or anyone in your household traveled domestically or internationally by air or cruise ship in the last 14 days?*
 2. *Do you or anyone in your household have the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, temperature over 100 degrees, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, loss of taste or smell?*
 3. *Have you or anyone in your household been notified of being exposed to someone with Covid 19 or respiratory illness in the last 14 days?*
 4. *Are you or anyone in your household currently under quarantine?*
- If you answer "yes" to any of these questions PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS.*
- ⇒ Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth
 - ⇒ Come to Mass 15 minutes early to check in
 - ⇒ Sanitizer will be available as you enter but we recommend that you bring your own
 - ⇒ Follow the ushers instructions for seating-Families may sit together but maintain social distancing from all others
 - ⇒ No worship aids will be provided but you may follow the Mass with your own book or on your mobile phone as long it is on silent mode.
 - ⇒ Follow the ushers direction to receive Holy Communion-Please receive in the hand.
 - ⇒ Follow directions when leaving the church.
 - ⇒ Please, only one person at a time in the restroom.
