

ANOINTING OF THE SICK HOTLINE: 510-259-8706

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

"I tell you that you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat" (John 6:25). The statement of Jesus seems too straightforward, and even rude. But it raises a basic question about our faith. Why am I a Christian, why do I come to church, why do I seek God? Is it mere convenience? Is it just out of habit and tradition? Or is it simply that God can solve my problems? In other words, do you seek the bread that the Father gives, or do you seek the Father who gives you bread?

People seem to naturally look for a source of material benefit that can supply their needs the easy way. They make God like a slot machine. They put in 25 cents, expecting \$1000 to come out. God is Not a Slot Machine, but many people live their lives as if he is. They tend to avoid the responsibilities for maintaining the garden that is earth left in their care. Instead, they look for a jackpot god to serve who will one day pay off for them.

Let us suppose, you are driving into a busy shopping mall or an airport. On the way you are wondering if you will find a parking space. In such awful situations, are you one of those who begin to pray very earnestly to Jesus or Mary that they should help you find a parking space? I too do this sometimes, particularly when I am anxious about journeys, meetings, and health! In one sense, this shows our trust in the providence of God. And, yes, God is capable of helping us find a parking space. But should he? Is God a mere problem solver? And should my relationship with God be reduced to solving all the issues of my daily life? So *"Do we seek the bread given by the father, or the father himself who gives us bread?"* St Ignatius once said: *"seek not the consolation of God, but seek the God of consolation."*

In the gospels, why does Jesus preach? Why does he perform his works – miracles and signs? Why does he feed the five thousand? Yes, these works are expressions of his compassion. But his intention is not merely to solve problems. In fact, he didn't manage to solve all the problems of the human condition. Jesus' works have one sole end: that we might build an intimate relationship with him, and in so doing we become one with the Father. It is this intimacy that is captured in the symbol of bread. It is this depth of relationship that is powerfully expressed in the Eucharist. What I eat becomes part of me. *"He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst" (Jn 6:35).* It is he whom we seek.

XVIII Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario Año B

"Les digo que no me buscan porque hayan visto las señales, sino porque tenían todo el pan que querían comer" (Juan 6:25). La declaración de Jesús parece demasiado sencilla e incluso grosera. Pero plantea una pregunta básica sobre nuestra fe. ¿Por qué soy Cristiano, por qué vengo a la iglesia, por qué busco a Dios? ¿Es mera conveniencia? ¿Es solo por costumbre y tradición? ¿O es simplemente que Dios puede resolver mis problemas? En otras palabras, ¿buscan el pan que el Padre da, o buscan al Padre que les da el pan?

La gente parece buscar naturalmente una fuente de beneficios materiales que pueda satisfacer sus necesidades de manera fácil. Hacen de Dios como una máquina tragamonedas. Ellos pusieron 25 centavos, esperando que salieran \$1,000. Dios no es una máquina tragamonedas, pero muchas personas viven sus vidas como si lo fuera. Suelen evitar las responsabilidades de mantenimiento del jardín que queda a su cuidado. En cambio, buscan un Dios del premio mayor al que servir y que algún día les pagará.

Supongamos que está conduciendo hacia un concurrido centro comercial o un aeropuerto. En el camino te preguntarás si encontrarás una plaza de aparcamiento. En situaciones tan espantosas, ¿eres de los que empiezan a orar con fervor a Jesús o María para que te ayuden a encontrar un lugar para estacionar? ¡Yo también hago esto a veces, especialmente cuando estoy ansioso por los viajes, las reuniones y la salud! En cierto sentido, esto muestra nuestra confianza en la providencia de Dios. Y, sí, Dios es capaz de ayudarnos a encontrar un lugar para estacionar. ¿Pero debería hacerlo? ¿Es Dios un mero solucionador de problemas? ¿Y debería reducir mi relación con Dios a resolver todos los problemas de mi vida diaria? Entonces, "*¿Buscamos el pan que nos da el padre, o el padre mismo que nos da el pan?*" San Ignacio dijo una vez: "*No busques la consolación de Dios, sino busca al Dios de la consolación*".

En los evangelios, ¿por qué predica Jesús? ¿Por qué realiza sus obras, milagros y señales? ¿Por qué alimenta a los cinco mil? Sí, estas obras son expresiones de su compasión. Pero su intención no es simplemente resolver problemas. De hecho, no logró resolver todos los problemas de la condición humana. Las obras de Jesús tienen un único fin: que podamos construir una relación íntima con él, y al hacerlo, nos convertimos en uno con el Padre. Es esta intimidad la que se capture en el símbolo del pan. Es esta profundidad de relación la que se expresa poderosamente en la Eucaristía. Lo que como se convierte en parte de mí. *"El que a mí viene, nunca tendrá hambre; el que cree en mí, no tendrá sed jamás"* (Jn 6:35). *Es a él a quien buscamos*.

BISHOP BARBER APPROVES CONTINUED USE OF TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS

"Last Friday, July 16, the Holy Father issued guidelines regarding the use of the Traditional Latin Mass, known as the Extraordinary Form. We will need time to properly study the document and its implications. In the meantime, I grant permission to those priests and parishes that already have my authorization to offer Masses according to the 1962 Missal to continue to celebrate them, following the norms of the Church. The Holy Father's constant concern throughout his papacy has been the care of souls and preserving the unity of the Church. These are my goals as well. I want to assure those faithful in the Diocese of Oakland who find sustenance and the consolation of Jesus Christ in the ancient form of worship that your spiritual needs will continue to be met."

Our Bishop, Michael Barber, will lift the dispensation for all the Catholics in our Diocese to attend Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation Masses from home on August 15.
