XXI Sunday Ordinary Time - August 22, 2021

Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b Psalm 34 Ephesians 5:21-32 John 6:55, 60-69

During these years, the analyses and studies on the crisis of Christian Churches in modern society have multiplied. Today's Gospel reading helps us to better know some facts about it, and it can help us to interpret and survive the evangelical crisis we are living through.


In the Gospel, Jesus synthesizes the crisis that is being created in His group: *The words I have told you are spirit and life. And yet, some of you don't believe.* It's true. Jesus introduces into those who follow Him, a new spirit; His words communicate life; the program He proposes can generate a movement capable of guiding the world towards a more dignified and fulfilling life. But, not by being in His group is faith guaranteed. There are those who refuse to accept His spirit and His life. His presence in Jesus' environment is fictitious; their faith in Him is not real. The real crisis within Christianity is always this: *Do we believe in Jesus or not?*

John says many backed down and did not go back to Jesus. In the crisis it is revealed who the true followers of Jesus are. The decisive choice is always that: *Who backs down, and who remains with Him and identified with His spirit and his life? Who is in favor and who is against His project?*

The group begins to shrink. Jesus is not irritated; He does not pronounce any judgment against anyone. He only asks one question to those who have stayed with Him: *Do you also want to leave?* It is the question that is asked today to those of us who remain in the Church: *What do we want? Why have we stayed? Is it to follow Jesus, welcoming His spirit and living in His style? Is it to work on His project?*

Peter's answer is exemplary: *Lord, to whom are we going to turn? You have words of eternal life.* Those who stay must do so for Jesus. Only by Jesus. For nothing more. They commit themselves to Him. The only reason to stay in His group is He. No one else. As painful as it may seem to us, the current crisis will be positive if those of us who remain in the Church, many or few, become disciples of Jesus, that is, men and women who live by His words of life.

XXI Domingo Tiempo Ordinario - 22 de agosto, 2021**Josué 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b****Salmo 33****Efesios****5:21-32****Juan 6:55, 60-69**

Durante estos años se han multiplicado los análisis y estudios sobre la crisis de las Iglesias cristianas en la sociedad moderna. La lectura del Evangelio de hoy nos ayuda a conocer mejor algunos datos, y nos puede ayudar a interpretar y vivir la crisis evangélica que vivimos.


En el Evangelio, Jesús resume así la crisis que se está creando en Su grupo: *Las palabras que les he dicho son espíritu y vida. Y, con todo, algunos de ustedes no creen.* Es cierto. Jesús introduce en quienes le siguen un espíritu nuevo; sus palabras comunican vida; el programa que propone puede generar un movimiento capaz de orientar el mundo hacia una vida más digna y plena.

Pero, no por el hecho de estar en Su grupo, está garantizada la fe. Hay quienes se resisten a aceptar su espíritu y su vida. Su presencia en el entorno de Jesús es ficticia; su fe en Él no es real. La verdadera crisis en el interior del cristianismo siempre es ésta: *¿creemos o no creemos en Jesús?*

Juan dice que *muchos se echaron atrás y no volvieron a ir con Jesús.* En la crisis se revela quiénes son los verdaderos seguidores de Jesús. La opción decisiva siempre es ésa: *¿quiénes se echan atrás y quiénes permanecen con Él identificados con su espíritu y su vida? ¿Quién está a favor y quién está en contra de su proyecto?*

El grupo comienza a disminuir. Jesús no se irrita, no pronuncia ningún juicio contra nadie. Sólo hace una pregunta a los que se han quedado junto a Él: *¿También ustedes se quieren marchar?* Es la pregunta que se nos hace hoy a quienes seguimos en la Iglesia: *¿Qué queremos nosotros? ¿Por qué nos hemos quedado? ¿Es para seguir a Jesús, acogiendo su espíritu y viviendo a su estilo? ¿Es para trabajar en su proyecto?*

La respuesta de Pedro es ejemplar: *Señor, ¿a quién vamos a acudir. Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna.* Los que se quedan, lo han de hacer por Jesús. Sólo por Jesús. Por nada más. Se comprometen con Él. El único motivo para permanecer en su grupo es Él. Nadie más. Por muy dolorosa que nos parezca, la crisis actual será positiva si los que nos quedamos en la Iglesia, muchos o pocos, nos vamos convirtiendo en discípulos de Jesús, es decir, en hombres y mujeres que vivimos de sus palabras de vida.

Shepherd's Closet will reopen on Tuesday, September 14th from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. in the Ministry Building. We provide used items to families who need children's clothes, from infant to 8 years old, as well as diapers, formula, furniture, and many other needed items.

Returning families who already have identification cards need to bring them. New families, and returning families without ID cards, must bring some form of identification (either a driver's license, ID card, or PG&E bill). All families will be issued Shepherd's Closet Identification cards.

Due to the covid pandemic, each person will need to wear a mask, and sanitize their hands before entering the building. Time will be limited for each person entering the building, and because of limited space, only 5 people at a time will be allowed in.
