

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CHURCH OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

First Sunday of Advent. Cycle C

Every year we begin the new liturgical cycle with Advent, which is presence and arrival. It is a presence that is always and constantly renewed, because we prepare ourselves to celebrate the mystery of the God who incarnates in the greatness of our human misery. On the First Sunday of Advent, "Cycle C" of the liturgical year, which will be based fundamentally on the Gospel of Luke, a message full of strength is offered, a call to hope, which is the proper thing of Advent: *Let us raise our heads because our liberation is approaching*. That is the key to the evangelical reading of the day. It is not the apocalyptic signs that should impress, but the message of what is proposed to us as an offer from God. Apocalyptic signs, in this world, have always occurred and will always be occurring.

Today's Gospel puts in the mouth of Jesus a series of apocalyptic signs that describe the end times. What is important is the message of hope that Jesus gives us. What the Gospel conveys to us is that whatever the moment and the modalities of the end, it will not be a chaotic or confused moment, for there the Son of man will be waiting with love and glory. A salvific, liberating power. The coming of the Son of man does not provoke fear, it transmits hope and security, the assurance that justice, peace and love will reign under the Lordship of Christ.

And in the meantime, what do we do? This in *the meantime* is the moment of our current life, it is our present here and now. How do we live now? In keeping with the hope that assures us that the goal of our life is Christ, or do we live as if at the end of life nothing is going to happen? Let us be careful, says the gospel: *no vices or worries about money, let us not be dragged by what is worthless.* What should be our concern then? The second reading says it: *"May the Lord make us overflow with mutual love and love for all."* As we await the Lord's return, we must make the most of the gift of love in a twofold direction: *mutual love,* that is, fraternal love for the sisters and brothers of our Christian communities; and *love for all,* that is, a love that also reaches those who do not belong to our groups, the stranger, the distant, the different.

The preface of this Sunday's Mass tells us that *the Lord will come again in glory and majesty, and all is at last made manifest, we who watch for that day may inherit the great promise in which now we dare to hope.* The Lord will come to meet every person: in the helpless sick, in the vulnerable migrant, in the lonely neighbor. So that when we encounter Him, we may bear witness to our hope: a kingdom in which we will all be happy. And since that is our most ardent desire, every day we pray in the Lord's Prayer that *Thy kingdom come*. In addition to asking for it, we seek to anticipate it already now in everything we say and do. The authenticity of our hope is manifested in fraternal love.

Advent is a good symbol of what the Christian life is. A life in hope, in faith and in love. Those of us who believe in Christ spend our lives waiting to meet Him and live loving as He loved us.

Primer Domingo de Adviento Ciclo C

Todos los años comenzamos el nuevo ciclo litúrgico con el Adviento, que es presencia y es llegada. Es una presencia de siempre y constantemente renovada, porque nos preparamos para celebrar el misterio del Dios que se encarna en la grandeza de nuestra miseria humana. En el Primer Domingo de Adviento, "Ciclo C" del año litúrgico, que estará apoyado fundamentalmente en el evangelio de Lucas, se ofrece un mensaje lleno de fuerza, una llamada a la esperanza, que es lo propio del Adviento: *Levantemos nuestras cabezas porque se acerca nuestra liberación*. Esa es la clave de la lectura evangélica del día. No son los signos apocalípticos los que deben impresionar, sino el mensaje de lo que se nos propone como oferta de parte de Dios. Los signos apocalípticos, en este mundo, siempre han ocurrido y siempre estarán ocurriendo.

El evangelio de hoy pone en boca de Jesús una serie de signos apocalípticos que describen el final de los tiempos. Lo importante es el mensaje de esperanza que nos da Jesús. Lo que nos transmite el evangelio es que, sea cual sea el momento y las modalidades del final, no será un momento caótico ni de desconcierto, pues allí estará esperando el Hijo del hombre con amor y gloria. Un poder salvífico, liberador. La venida del Hijo del hombre no provoca miedo, transmite esperanza y seguridad, la seguridad de que bajo el señorío de Cristo reinará la justicia, la paz y el amor.

Y mientras tanto, ¿qué hacemos? Este *mientras tanto* es el momento de nuestra vida actual, es nuestro presente aquí y ahora. ¿Cómo vivimos ahora? ¿En consonancia con la esperanza que nos asegura que la meta de nuestra vida es Cristo, o vivimos como si al final de la vida nada fuera a suceder? Tengamos cuidado, dice el evangelio: *nada de vicios ni de preocupaciones por el dinero, no nos dejemos arrastrar por lo que nada vale.* ¿Cuál debe ser nuestra preocupación entonces? Lo dice la segunda lectura: *"que el Señor nos haga rebosar de amor mutuo y de amor a todos"*. Mientras esperamos el regreso del Señor, debemos explotar al máximo el don del amor en una doble dirección: *amor mutuo*, o sea, amor fraterno a las hermanas y hermanos de nuestras comunidades cristianas; *y amor a todos*, o sea, un amor que alcanza también a los que no pertenecen a nuestros grupos, al extraño, al alejado, al diferente.

El prefacio de este domingo nos dice que *el Señor vendrá por segunda vez en el esplendor de su grandeza, para que así podamos recibir los bienes prometidos que ahora aguardamos en vigilante espera*. El Señor vendrá al encuentro de cada persona: en el enfermo desvalido, en el emigrante vulnerable, en el vecino solitario. Para que al encontrarlo a Él demos testimonio de nuestra esperanza: un reino en el que todos seremos felices. Y como ese es nuestro más ardiente deseo, todos los días rezamos en el Padre nuestro *que venga ese Reino*. Además de pedirlo, buscamos anticiparlo ya ahora en todo lo que decimos y hacemos. La autenticidad de nuestra esperanza se manifiesta en el amor fraterno.

El adviento es un buen símbolo de lo que es la vida cristiana. Una vida en esperanza, en fe y en amor. Los que creemos en Cristo nos pasamos la vida esperando encontrarle y vivimos amando como Él nos amó.

We are all invited to celebrate the feast of the Virgin of Guadalupe on December 12, this is the program:



During Advent, the Church invites us to focus more intentionally on preparing ourselves to welcome the Incarnate Christ. Some practical tips for you and your family may include the following:

Practice Self-denial

By removing anything that distracts you from the spiritual life, such as excessive use of the internet or television. In place of these distractions embrace a little more silence so that you can listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit within you and create sacred space for Christ to enter your life.

Make Use of the Sacrament of Penance



This certainly helps us respond to Jesus' call for conversion. Conversion is an ongoing struggle for every Christian—a struggle that is "directed toward holiness and eternal life to which the Lord never ceases to call us" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1426).

Take a Refresher Course in the Catholic Faith

By reading the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* on your own or with others. During the Year Of Faith, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI had urged the flock to study the fundamental content of our faith as articulated in the *Catechism*. The season of Advent is a marvelous opportunity to set aside time for spiritual reading of the *Catechism*.

Commit to Praying with the Scriptures

St. Jerome firmly insisted that "ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ" because he "who does not know Scripture does not know the power and wisdom of God". Some simple ways of accomplishing this may include reflecting on the Psalms or reading the Sunday Gospel passage during the week. You can find the readings on the website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Learn to Pray With Your Spouse and Family

The family that prays together stays together.

Decorate Your Home to Reflect the Liturgical Season

Displaying the nativity scene is a traditional way to remember the meaning of Advent. It is a great focal point for the family and especially for children who love to hear the Christmas story. The Advent wreath is another important addition to any Catholic home. Place it in the center of your dinner table, light the appropriate candles, and sing a hymn or recite a prayer together as you anticipate the coming of Christ.
