

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Gospel of this 2nd Sunday, Year C invites us to reflect on the first miracle of Jesus of changing water into wine at Cana and the role of Mother Mary in this miracle. I share with you a reflection from Pope Francis when he celebrated the first Mass of his Latin American trip on June 6, 2015, in Ecuador's Semanes Park. The Pope focused his homily on the role of Mary, inviting the audience to "journey with her to Cana." He chose three characteristics of Mary to meditate on – her motherhood, her prayerfulness, and her willingness to act.

Mary's motherhood is seen when she pays attention to the needs of the newlyweds at Cana, noticing when they have run out of wine for their guests. Wine is a sign of "happiness, love, and plenty," and that many families today have also run out of "wine" due to loneliness, unemployment, illness, and other difficulties. Mary, an "attentive and concerned" mother, shuns self-centeredness to realize when others no longer have wine in their lives.

Secondly, Mary exhibits prayerfulness when she "approaches Jesus with confidence" to make known the newlyweds' problem to Him. Family is a school of prayer where people are reminded that they do not live in isolation but must be concerned about the well-being of loved ones around them. In the family, "we are one and we have a neighbor close at hand."

Finally, Mary's willingness to act is seen as she turns to the servants at the wedding feast and tells them to follow Jesus' commands. Mary's words are also directed at us; we should do what Jesus tells us, that is, give our lives in the service of love. Family is a place where people can serve one another in love. All in the family deserve this love; "no one is rejected, everyone is worth the same." Family is "the nearest hospital," "the first school for the young," "the best home for the elderly," and "a small Church." We need to put our efforts into strengthening the family because it is one institution which "cannot be replaced."

May God through the intercession of our Mother Mary change all the water of fear, anxiety, difficulty, frustration, suffering and death in our lives into the wine of joy, hope, love, plenty and salvation. Mary, Help of Christians, pray for us! Amen.

El Evangelio de este segundo Domingo del año C nos invita a reflexionar sobre el primer milagro de Jesús de cambiar el agua en vino en Caná y el papel de la Madre María en este milagro. Comparto con ustedes una reflexión del Papa Francisco cuando celebró la primera Misa de su viaje Latinoamericano el 6 de Junio de 2015 en el Parque Semanes de Ecuador. El Papa centró su homilía en el papel de María, invitando a la audiencia a “viajar con ella a Caná”. Eligió tres características de María para meditar: su maternidad, su oración y su disponibilidad para actuar.

La maternidad de María se ve cuando presta atención a las necesidades de los recién casados en Caná, advirtiéndolos cuando se han quedado sin vino para sus invitados. El vino es un signo de “felicidad, amor y abundancia”, y que muchas familias hoy en día también se han quedado sin “vino” debido a la soledad, el desempleo, la enfermedad y otras dificultades. María, madre “atenta y preocupada”, huye del egocentrismo para darse cuenta cuando los demás ya no tienen vino en su vida.

En segundo lugar, María exhibe oración cuando “se acerca a Jesús con confianza” para hacerle saber el problema de los recién casados. La familia es una escuela de oración donde se recuerda a las personas que no vivan aisladas, sino que deben preocuparse por el bienestar de los seres queridos que los rodean. En la familia, “somos uno y tenemos un vecino al alcance de la mano”.

Finalmente, la disposición de María para actuar se ve cuando se dirige a los sirvientes en la fiesta de bodas y les dice que sigan los mandatos de Jesús. Las palabras de María también se dirigen a nosotros; debemos hacer lo que Jesús nos dice, es decir, dar nuestra vida al servicio del amor. La familia es un lugar donde las personas pueden servirse unas a otras con amor. Todos en la familia merecen este amor; “nadie es rechazado, todos valen lo mismo.” La familia es “el hospital más cercano”, “la primera escuela para los jóvenes”, “el mejor hogar para los ancianos” y “una pequeña Iglesia”. Necesitamos poner nuestros esfuerzos en fortalecer a la familia porque es una institución que “no puede ser reemplazada”.

Que Dios por intercesión de nuestra Madre María cambie toda el agua del miedo, ansiedad, dificultad, frustración, sufrimiento y muerte de nuestras vidas en vino de alegría, esperanza, amor, abundancia y salvación.

¡María, Auxiliadora, ruega por nosotros! Amén.

You might have chosen not to marry in the Church various reasons. Now, worry no more. Let's get your marriage convalidated!


IT IS ALL FREE OF CHARGE!



New Message from our Bishop Barber in regard to Mass Attendance amid the Covid spike.

Attendance at Mass

Please be aware that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill, especially those who suffer from contagious disease. Long before this pandemic, the Church has always recognized that there are "serious" or "grave" reasons that prevent Catholics from attending Mass. For example, if a person is sick or homebound, or living/visiting areas of the world where access to the Mass is limited, or a situation arises that prevents travel (snowstorm or flat tire), such persons would not be bound by the obligation.

In the case of this pandemic, serious or grave reasons would include:

Anyone who is sick, symptomatic, or has been recently exposed to the coronavirus. Protecting the health of others is an act of Christian charity and our moral duty to one another.

Anyone with significant health risk factors that requires them to avoid public spaces, or if you care for someone with significant risk factors.

Anyone who cannot attend Mass through no fault of their own, for example, a parent caring for a sick child, or if the priest is sick.

As always, you are reminded to use common good sense in the reception of Holy Communion during the annual cold and flu season as well.

General Precautions

Wearing masks and social distancing remain two of the most effective means of preventing and spreading disease.

At this time, there is no government restriction on capacity for indoor service, but social distancing and adequate ventilation are still required.

The Sign of Peace should still be exchanged without physical contact.
