Jesus' warning is easy to understand.

"A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles."

In a society damaged by so many injustices and abuses, where the bushes of interests and mutual rivalries grow, and where so many thorns of hatred, discord and aggressiveness sprout, healthy people are needed to bear another kind of fruit. What can we each do to heal a little the social coexistence so damaged between us?

Maybe we should start by not making life harder for anyone than it already is. Strive to live in such a way that, at least together with us, life is more human and bearable. Do not poison the environment with our pessimism, our bitterness and aggressiveness. Create in our environment different relationships made of trust, kindness, and cordiality.

When we listen to and welcome someone, we are freeing them from loneliness, and we are giving them new strength to live. No matter how difficult and painful the situation in which he finds himself, if the person discovers that he is not alone and has someone to turn to, hope will be born again in him. What a great task it can be today to offer refuge, welcome and respite to so many people battered by life.

We must also develop much more comprehension. Let people know that whatever they do and no matter how serious their mistakes, in me they will always find someone who will understand them. Perhaps we should start by not despising anyone even inwardly. Do not condemn or judge rashly and without any compassion. Most of our judgments and convictions of people only show our poor human quality.

It is also important to put inner strength in the one who suffers. Our problem is not having problems, but not having the strength to face them. Next to us there are people who suffer from insecurity, loneliness, failure, illness, incomprehension... They don't just need recipes to solve their crisis. They need someone to share in their suffering and put into their lives the inner strength to sustain them.

Forgiveness can be another source of hope in our society. People who do not hold grudges or insanely feed hatred or revenge, but know how to forgive from within, sow hope in the world. Together with these people, life will always grow.

It is not a question of closing our eyes to the evil and injustice of the human being. It is simply a matter of listening to the slogan of St. Paul: "Do not allow yourselves to be overcome by evil; rather, overcome evil with good" The healthiest way to fight evil in a society so damaged in some human values is to do good without returning anyone evil for evil...; as far as possible, and as far as it depends on us, in peace with all men."

La advertencia de Jesús es fácil de entender. “No hay árbol bueno que produzca frutos malos, ni árbol malo que produzca frutos buenos. Cada árbol se conoce por sus frutos. No se recogen higos de las zarzas, ni se cortan uvas de los espinos”

En una sociedad dañada por tantas injusticias y abusos, donde crecen las zarzas de los intereses y las mutuas rivalidades, y donde brotan tantos espinos de odios, discordia y agresividad, son necesarias personas sanas que den otra clase de frutos. ¿Qué podemos hacer cada uno para sanar un poco la convivencia social tan dañada entre nosotros?

Tal vez hemos de empezar por no hacerle a nadie la vida más difícil de lo que ya es. Esforzarnos por vivir de tal manera que, al menos junto a nosotros, la vida sea más humana y llevadera. No envenenar el ambiente con nuestro pesimismo, nuestra amargura y agresividad. Crear en nuestro entorno unas relaciones diferentes hechas de confianza, bondad y cordialidad.

Cuando escuchamos y acogemos a alguien, lo estamos liberando de la soledad y le estamos infundiendo nuevas fuerzas para vivir. Por muy difícil y dolorosa que sea la situación en que se encuentra, si la persona descubre que no está sola y tiene a alguien a quien acudir, nacerá de nuevo en ella la esperanza. Qué gran tarea puede ser hoy ofrecer refugio, acogida y respiro a tantas personas maltratadas por la vida.

Hemos de desarrollar también mucho más la capacidad de comprensión. Que las personas sepan que, hagan lo que hagan y por muy graves que sean sus errores, en mí encontrarán siempre a alguien que las comprenderá. Tal vez hemos de empezar por no despreciar a nadie ni siquiera interiormente. No condenar ni juzgar precipitadamente y sin compasión alguna. La mayoría de nuestros juicios y condenas de las personas sólo muestran nuestra poca calidad humana.

Es también importante poner fuerza interior en el que sufre. Nuestro problema no es tener problemas, sino no tener fuerza para enfrentarnos a ellos. Junto a nosotros hay personas que sufren inseguridad, soledad, fracaso, enfermedad, incomprendimiento... No necesitan sólo receptoras para resolver su crisis. Necesitan a alguien que comparta su sufrimiento y ponga en sus vidas la fuerza interior que las sostenga.

El perdón puede ser otra fuente de esperanza en nuestra sociedad. Las personas que no guardan rencor ni alimentan de manera insana el odio o la venganza, sino que saben perdonar desde dentro, siembran esperanza en el mundo. Junto a esas personas siempre crecerá la vida.

No se trata de cerrar los ojos al mal y a la injusticia del ser humano. Se trata sencillamente de escuchar la consigna de san Pablo: “No te dejes vencer por el mal; antes bien, vence al mal con el bien” La manera más sana de luchar contra el mal en una sociedad tan dañada en algunos valores humanos es hacer el bien sin devolver a nadie mal por mal...; en lo posible, y en cuanto de nosotros dependa, en paz con todos los hombres”

To prepare for this celebration, we will have an "on site" marriage preparation session which will take place on **March 12th from 9am to 3pm**.





Dearest Flock of the Good Shepherd,

We are grateful that we have a church with beautiful premises. We are committed to keep the church vibrant, nice and neat.
