Baptisms: In order to make baptismal arrangements contact carmen@goodshepherdpittsburg.org


Marriages: In order to make marriage arrangements contact carmen@goodshepherdpittsburg.org 6 months prior to marriage date.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The gospel of this 5th Sunday tells us that the disciples went fishing but caught nothing despite their expertise. Then Jesus stepped in, asking them to their net and the result was they were not able to pull the net because they caught so many fish.

We talk a lot about success nowadays. What's a key point to success? Commitment. It is said that up to 90% of all patients do not follow their doctor's advice. They leave half empty medicine bottles, cheat on their diets, and fail to return for check-ups. Sometimes we forget that doctors go to school for eight to ten years they know more than us, but we still: "Do it our way". The point is this. When God gives us principles to live by, or an assignment to accomplish, or a word to guide us, He expects us to obey Him for he knows what is best for us! In the Gospel, you see a carpenter teach the fishermen how to fish. The natural reaction to this situation would become one. We have fished all night but caught nothing. Now you tell us to fish again? You, a carpenter, what do you know about fishing? I am tired. I want to go home and rest. But Peter followed God's command to cast the net.

Friends, the Lord's timing is often different from ours. We may be ready to pack up and go home because of frustration or disappointment, but that may be the very moment the Lord says, "Okay, I'm ready for you to launch out and get blessed." Peter caught nothing because he fished on the wrong side of the boat. He did it his way without Jesus. We at times try our best to succeed, but we fail. We try to stay away from sins, but we fail. We try to improve in our spiritual life but failed because most of the times we do it our way. We fished at the wrong side of the boat. That's when Jesus comes and says: "Cast your net to the right side of the boat." Why the right side? It is because Jesus is seated at the right hand of his Father. He invites us to fish on his side for the blessings to come.

How often have we trusted Jesus in our hopeless situation? How much do we rely on him for our success? Today's gospel reading is a message of hope for us. It assures us of success no matter how much effort we have wasted and no matter how many times we have tried and failed. This type of success is guaranteed if only you are humble enough to listen to Jesus and follow his directives. So let us go forward saying: "but at your command I will lower the nets, Lord!" Amen!

Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

El evangelio de este quinto Domingo nos dice que los discípulos fueron a pescar pero no pescaron nada a pesar de su experiencia. Entonces Jesús intervino, pidiéndoles que echaran la red y el resultado fue que no pudieron tirar de la red pesada porque atraparon tantos peces.

Hoy en día hablamos mucho sobre el éxito. ¿Cuál es un punto clave para el éxito? Compromiso. Se dice que hasta el 90% de todos los pacientes no siguen los consejos de su médico. Dejan frascos de medicamentos medio vacíos, hacen trampa en sus dietas y no regresan a los chequeos médicos. A veces olvidamos que los médicos van a la escuela durante ocho o diez años, saben más que nosotros, pero aún así: "Lo hacemos a nuestra manera". El punto es este. Cuando Dios nos da principios para vivir, o una tarea que cumplir, o una palabra para guiarnos, ¡Él espera que le obedezcamos porque él sabe lo que es mejor para nosotros! En el Evangelio, vez a un carpintero enseñar a los pescadores a pescar. La reacción natural ante esta situación sería: ¡vamos! Hemos pescado toda la noche pero no hemos podido pescar nada. ¿Ahora nos dices que volvamos a pescar? Tú, un carpintero, ¿qué sabes de pesca? Estoy cansado. Quiero ir a casa y descansar. Pero Pedro aun así siguió el mandato de Dios de echar la red.


Amigos, el tiempo del Señor a menudo es diferente al nuestro. Es posible que estemos listos para empacar e irnos a casa debido a la frustración o la desilusión, pero ese puede ser el mismo momento en que el Señor dice: "Está bien, estoy listo para que te lances y seas bendecido". Pedro no atrapó nada porque pescó en el lado equivocado del bote. Lo hizo a su manera sin Jesús. A veces hacemos todo lo posible para tener éxito, pero fallamos. Tratamos de alejarnos de los pecados, pero fallamos. Tratamos de mejorar en la vida espiritual pero fallamos porque la mayoría de las veces lo hacemos a nuestra manera. Pescamos en el lado equivocado del barco. Es entonces cuando viene Jesús y dice: "Echad vuestra red a la derecha de la barca". ¿Por qué el lado derecho? Es porque Jesús está sentado a la diestra de su Padre. Él nos invita a pescar de su lado las bendiciones por venir.

¿Cuántas veces hemos confiado en Jesús en nuestra situación desesperada? ¿Cuánto confiamos en él para nuestro éxito? La lectura del evangelio de hoy es un mensaje de esperanza para nosotros. Nos asegura el éxito sin importar cuánto esfuerzo hayamos desperdiciado y sin importar cuántas veces lo hayamos intentado y fallado. Este tipo de éxito está garantizado si eres lo suficientemente humilde para escuchar a Jesús y seguir sus directivas.

Así que sigamos adelante diciendo: "¡pero a tu orden echaré las redes, Señor!" ¡Amén!


Attention! We accept only couples that are currently civilly married, and have never been previously married or divorced.



Adsumus Sante Spiritus

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer Adsumus Sancte Spiritus, the first word of the Latin original meaning, “We stand before You, Holy Spirit,” which has been historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years, being attributed to Saint Isidore of Seville (c. 560 - 4 April 636). As we are called to embrace this synodal path of the Synod 2021-2023, this prayer invites the Holy Spirit to operate within us so that we may be a community and a people of grace. For the Synod 2021-2023, we propose to use this simplified version, so that any group or liturgical assembly can pray more easily.

SYNOD PRAYER

We stand before You, Holy Spirit,
 as we gather together in Your name.
 With You alone to guide us,
 make Yourself at home in our hearts;
 Teach us the way we must go
 and how we are to pursue it.
 We are weak and sinful;
 do not let us promote disorder.
 Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path
 nor partiality influence our actions.
 Let us find in You our unity
 so that we may journey together to eternal life
 and not stray from the way of truth
 and what is right.
 All this we ask of You,
 who are at work in every place and time
 in the communion of the Father and the Son,
 forever and ever. Amen


