Palm Sunday

When we hear this Passion narrative, we feel varying levels of disdain for Judas who betrays him, Peter who denies him, the chief priests who despise him, Herod who mocks him, the people who crucify him, and Barabbas who is guilty but gets to go free. But wait. Barabbas — the guilty who goes free? Who is Barabbas? It's me, It's you. It's us. How many times have I stood on that platform with Pilate and Jesus and I'm the Barabbas. And they start to take my chains off and I say 'NO! NO! I DESERVE THIS. I DESERVE THE GUILT, I DE-SERVE THE SHAME, I DESERVE THE CONSEQUENCE.' And Jesus seems to look at me and say " NO child, let Me have it. Let Me have your sin, let Me have your pain." and I say 'No God I did it to myself... I deserve it.' —- " NO!" God I'm so ashamed. He says " Give Me your shame..." But God, what if I do it again? He says " I'll still be here..." Oh God I don't want to hurt You, I love You, I don't want to do this anymore. He says " Everything will be alright, just give Me your sins..."

We hear all the time that Christ died for our sins but how often do we truly ponder what this truly means? Today I challenge you to put yourself not just in the crowd but up in front of the crowd. **To become Barabbas**. Each of us need to identify ourselves as Barabbas standing next to Jesus as a liar, a cheater, a thief, a murderer, a betrayer, a sinner and let the crowd choose you over the innocent Jesus. When you do this, Christ's offering becomes something so much more. It becomes real. Christ chose to stand in our place. He suffered, died **for us** and set us free. He knew our sins, our shortcomings, and our failures and yet He still stood before the crowd and let them choose to release us instead of Him.

Our lives were changed in a way we could never understand on that critical day. We were given a second chance at life. With this second chance we are asked to lay down our life of sin and pick up our cross as Jesus did. The question remains: will you stand as Barabbas, sinful and proud or will you take your place beside Christ on the cross, acknowledging your sinfulness and begging as the criminal did "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."? Make your choice.

Domingo de Palma

Cuando escuchamos esta narración de la Pasión, sentimos diferentes niveles de desprecio por Judas que lo traiciona, Pedro que lo niega, los principales sacerdotes que lo desprecian, Herodes que se burla de él, la gente que lo crucifica y Barrabás que es culpable pero lo dejan ir libre. Pero espera. Barrabás: ¿el culpable que sale libre? ¿Quién es Barrabás? Soy yo, eres tú. Somos nosotros. ¿Cuántas veces me he parado en esa plataforma con Pilatos y Jesús y yo soy el Barrabás? y me empiezan a quitar las cadenas y digo '¡NO! ¡NO! MEREZCO ESTO. MEREZCO LA CULPA, MEREZCO LA VERGÜENZA, ME MEREZCO LA CONSECUENCIA.' y Jesús parece mirarme y decir "NO hijo, déjame tenerlo. Déjame tener tu pecado, déjame tener tu dolor". y digo 'No Dios, me lo hice a mí mismo... Me lo merezco'. -- " ¡NO!" Dios, estoy tan avergonzado. Él dice "Dame tu vergüenza..." Pero Dios, ¿y si lo vuelvo a hacer? Él dice: "Todavía estaré aquí..." Oh Dios, no quiero lastimarte, te amo, no quiero hacer esto nunca más. Él dice: "Todo estará bien, solo dame tus pecados..."

Escuchamos todo el tiempo que Cristo murió por nuestros pecados, pero ¿con qué frecuencia realmente reflexionamos sobre lo que esto realmente significa? Hoy te desafío a que te pongas no solo en la multitud sino al frente de la multitud. **Para convertirse en Barrabás**. Cada uno de nosotros debe identificarse como Barrabás parado junto a Jesús como un mentiroso, un tramposo, un ladrón, un asesino, un traidor, un pecador y dejar que la multitud te elija a ti sobre el inocente Jesús. Cuando haces esto, la ofrenda de Cristo se convierte en algo mucho más. Se vuelve real. Cristo eligió ponerse en nuestro lugar. Él sufrió, murió por nosotros y nos hizo libres. Él conocía nuestros pecados, nuestras deficiencias y nuestros fracasos y, sin embargo, se paró frente a la multitud y les permitió elegir liberarnos a nosotros en lugar de Él.

Nuestras vidas cambiaron de una manera que nunca pudimos entender en ese día crítico. Nos dieron una segunda oportunidad en la vida. Con esta segunda oportunidad se nos pide que dejemos nuestra vida de pecado y tomemos nuestra cruz como lo hizo Jesús. La pregunta permanece: ¿estarás como Barrabás, pecador y orgulloso o tomarás tu lugar junto a Cristo en la cruz, reconociendo tu pecaminosidad y rogando como lo hizo el criminal: "Jesús, acuérdate de mí cuando vengas en tu reino"? Haz tu elección.

Holy Week Timeline Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday

While Holy Week marks the final week of Jesus' earthly life, it is also the end of the Catholic Liturgical season of Lent on Holy Thursday and the 40 day Lenten fast on Holy Saturday. The week begins with Palm Sunday. The exact timeline is debatable but here is a possible timeline of Jesus' final week:

Palm Sunday

On the Sunday before his death, Jesus began his trip to Jerusalem. Nearing the village of Bethlehem, He sent two of his disciples ahead to look for a donkey and a colt. Riding on the donkey, He humbly but triumphantly entered into the city of Jerusalem. The gathering crowds spread their cloaks and palm branches on the road and sang "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest. Upon arriving, Jesus entered the temple area and with righteous anger overturned the tables and seats of the money changers and merchants saying, "My house shall be a house of prayer."

Monday

Growing hungry in the morning, he approached a fig tree but found it not bearing any fruit so he cursed it and it immediately withered away. The disciples asked how He did that and Jesus told them that even they could move mountains with prayer and faith.

Tuesday

He arrived in the temple area again and with mounting hostility, the chief priests, scribes and elders questioned Jesus' authority and wanted Him to tell them where it came from. He refused because they would not answer a question He proposed to them.

He then told several parables including "The Two

Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.





Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the garden.





Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.



Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.

Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.



Sons", "The Tenants", and "The Wedding Feast" and the Pharisees and Sadducees continued to try and entrap Jesus with things like paying taxes, the resurrection, the greatest commandment and the messiah being David's son.

Wednesday

Jesus predicts the destruction of the temple and the beginning of calamities but tells His disciples not to be alarmed because these things must happen and it will not be the end. He tells them of the coming of the Son of Man upon the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. He states that day and hour of the coming is unknown to everyone but the Father.

Later at the house of Simon the leper in Bethany, Jesus is anointed with the expensive jar of perfumed oil and with this He tells His disciples that this act is preparing Him for burial.

Holy Thursday

Holy Thursday is the first day of the Feast of the Unleavened Bread and preparation for the Passover. Jesus' disciples prepare the upper room for it as Jesus had ordered. That evening after sunset, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples as they prepared to share in the Passover. While they were eating, Jesus announces to His apostles that one of them will betray Him. And then He took the bread and wine and instituted the Holy Eucharist.

After supper and signing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives where Jesus fortold the denial by Peter. And then they went to Gethsemane so that Jesus could pray. The agony He was feeling was so great at this time that an angel appeared to strengthen Him.

Upon finding His disciples asleep three times, He told them to get up because His betrayer was at hand. At this time, Judas and a crowd with swords and clubs sent by the chief priests and elders arrived and arrested Jesus. They sent Jesus to Caiaphas the high priest along with the Sanhedrin who tried to get Jesus to give false testimony. He remained silent until finally He said that the Son of Man is coming. Peter, hiding out in the courtyard, denied knowing Jesus three times.

<u>Good Friday</u>

In the morning, the Sanhedrin leads Jesus to Pilate. Pilate questions Jesus but could not find any crime He committed. He offered to release a murderer named Barabbas or Jesus and the crowds called for Barabbas and for Jesus to be crucified. He washed His hands Soldiers then took Jesus away and stripped Him of His clothes, crowned Him with a crown of thorns, mocked and spit on Him and then beat Him before leading Him away to be crucified. They pressed a man named Simon into service to help Jesus carry His cross. Upon arriving at Golgotha around nine in the morning, they crucified Him along with two criminals. From noon onward, darkness came over the land. At three o'clock, Jesus cried out "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me." Jesus then cried out again and died. His body was taken down and placed in a tomb.

Holy Saturday

The chief priests requested that a guard be placed at the tomb so that Jesus's body could not be stolen and then later claimed to have risen from the dead. Pilate agreed and so they secured the tomb, fixed a seal upon the stone and set a guard.

Easter Sunday

At dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body. They found the stone rolled away and the tomb empty and an angel of God was there who told them that Jesus was not there and that He had been raised from the dead. He told them to go tell the disciples. Jesus met them on their way there and told them not to be afraid. He sent the Marys to Peter and the apostles to tell them to meet Him in Galilee.

He met the eleven apostles there at Galilee. There, He commissioned them "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." After telling them He will be with them until the end of the age, he ascended into Heaven and took His seat at the right hand of God the Father. Alleluia! Christ the Lord is Risen.


