

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

It is said that: *the worst thing in this life is to have eyes but cannot see.* This is exactly today's gospel is about. Jesus, the Messiah was there in the midst of the crowd, but they didn't recognize him. They had eyes but they didn't see him. The one who saw him was a blind man, Bartimaeus. What an irony! What does today gospel tell us? It challenges our ability to see God's presence among us. We all have eyes, but do we truly see him?

There is the sheer persistence of Bartimaeus. Nothing would stop his demand to come face to face with Jesus. He was utterly determined to meet the one person whom he longed to confront with his trouble. In the mind of Bartimaeus there was not just a vague or sentimental wish to see Jesus. It was a desperate desire. And it is that desperate desire that gets things done. Bartimaeus knew precisely what he wanted--his sight. Too often our admiration for Jesus is a vague attraction. When we go to the doctor, we want him to deal with some definite situation. When we go to the dentist, we do not ask him to extract any tooth, but the one that is painful. It should be so with us when we come to Jesus. When we go to Jesus, if we are as desperately definite as Bartimaeus, things will happen.

The story of Bartimaeus is our story—the story of beggars seeking mercy, of a blind human race trapped in the dark, yearning to see. It's the story of people who need a miracle. Christ is waiting to give us that miracle, if only we have faith. Rise! Get up! The Lord is calling us. To a world of despair, he offers hope. To a world of confusion, he brings clarity. To a world of darkness and sin, Christ is our light. Amen!

30º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario Año B

Se dice que: lo peor de esta vida es tener ojos pero no ver. De esto trata exactamente el evangelio de hoy. Jesús, el Mesías, estaba allí en medio de la multitud, pero no lo reconocieron. Tenían ojos pero no lo vieron. El que lo vio fue un hombre ciego, Bartimeo. ¡Qué ironía! ¿Qué nos dice el evangelio de hoy? Desafía nuestra capacidad de ver la presencia de Dios entre nosotros. Todos tenemos ojos, pero ¿lo vemos realmente?

Está la pura persistencia de Bartimeo. Nada detendría su demanda de encontrarse cara a cara con Jesús. Estaba absolutamente decidido a encontrarse con la única persona a la que anhelaba confrontar con su problema. En la mente de Bartimeo no había solo un deseo vago o sentimental de ver a Jesús. Era un deseo desesperado. Y es ese deseo desesperado el que hace que las cosas se hagan. Bartimeo sabía exactamente lo que quería: su vista. Con demasiada frecuencia nuestra admiración por Jesús es una atracción vaga. Cuando vamos al médico, queremos que se ocupe de alguna situación concreta. Cuando vamos al dentista, no le pedimos que nos extraiga cualquier diente, sino el que nos duele. Así debería ser con nosotros cuando vamos a Jesús. Cuando vamos a Jesús, si somos tan desesperadamente determinados como Bartimeo, las cosas sucederán.

La historia de Bartimeo es nuestra historia: la historia de mendigos que buscan misericordia, de una raza humana ciega atrapada en la oscuridad, anhelando ver. Es la historia de gente que necesita un milagro. Cristo está esperando darnos ese milagro, si tan solo tenemos fe. ¡Levántate! ¡Levántate! El Señor nos está llamando. A un mundo de desesperación, él ofrece esperanza. A un mundo de confusión, él trae claridad. En un mundo de oscuridad y pecado, Cristo es nuestra luz. ¡Amén!


Besides these 4 big receptions, there will be light receptions like coffee and donuts, eggs ... served after the week days Masses in front of the church.

Come join us for some Halloween fun on Sunday, Oct. 27 after all masses!


We will have decorated cars and offrendas that everyone can participate in!!

We will take mass intention requests written form beginning **Thursday, October 31 at 8:00 am (any received prior will not be valid)** in person only in office during office hours Monday through Thursday; no emails will be accepted (if you have a very special circumstance please contact Carmen after the first day of opening book) with a maximum of 6 masses for the 1st round (**until Nov. 21**) then you can request more (6 max. @ a time). **No phone calls or drop offs please so that we can maintain order.** We ask that you make sure your email address and telephone number are included in your request form so that we may contact you if there are any concerns. Donation request remains \$10 per mass intention. In accordance with Diocesan policy, only the Saturday morning 8 am mass may be double-booked for intentions. Initially we are limiting the number of requests per family to 6 maximum so that everyone has a fair opportunity.

Mass intentions are available from Monday through Friday masses at 7:30 am, Saturday morning masses at 8 am, our weekend schedule of Saturday at 5:30 pm, Sunday at 8 am, 10 am , 12 noon and 3 pm in Spanish.

We also have mass intentions available on the 1st Friday of the month at 7 pm and the 3rd Friday of each month at 7 pm in Spanish if you'd like to request any of those and any other days of obligation.



Mosaic Mural of the Crucifixion (Central Piece)

Design, fabricate and install 10' wide by 14' high
 (140 square feet)

Materials of the mosaic mural: Finest Venetian Smalti Glass and Gold Glass, Marble, Granite, Natural stone, Raw semi-precious stones.

All the materials are from Italy.

Total amount: \$200,040.00

Price per square foot - \$1,400.00

Sanctuary Improvement Project

(Back wall framing, Electrical, Sanctuary Flooring, New ambo marching the altar,)

Total Base Estimate \$193, 256.00

So the total cost of the whole sanctuary renovation is about **\$400,000.00** including the 140 square feet Mosaic Mural of the Crucifixion.
