Father Carl's Corner April 5-6

Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Catholic Church (Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace)

184. The Church's love for the poor is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes, by the poverty of Jesus and by his attention to the poor. This love concerns material poverty and also the numerous forms of cultural and religious poverty. The Church, since her origin and in spite of the failing of many of her members, has not ceased to work for their relief, defense and liberation through numerous works of charity which remain indispensable always and everywhere!.. with countless works of corporal and spiritual mercy. "Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity: it is also a work of justice pleasing to God," even if the practice of charity is not limited to alms-giving but implies addressing the social and political dimensions of the problem of poverty. In her teaching the Church constantly returns to this relationship between charity and justice: When we attend to the needs of those in want, we give them what is theirs, not ours. More than performing works of mercy, we are paying a debt of justice..." (Read also Catechism of the Catholic Church #2447)

This document of the Catholic Church summarizes our mission as Christians. During Lent, we are not just invited to do almsgiving which is give alms or helping someone during the season. We are invited to enter into a way of life or make it a part of who we are as baptized and as disciples of Jesus on a daily basis. This way of life is expressed more fully in God's call and invitation to do or practice works of mercy which are the corporal and the spiritual works of mercy.

The corporal works of mercy are:

- To feed the hungry;
- To give drink to the thirsty;
- To clothe the naked;
- To shelter the homeless;
- To visit the sick;
- To visit prisoners;
- To bury the dead.

The spiritual works of mercy are:

- To instruct the ignorant;
- To counsel the doubtful;
- To admonish sinners;
- To bear wrongs patiently;
- To forgive offences willingly;
- To comfort the afflicted;
- To pray for the living and the dead.

Do good and avoid evil (St. Thomas Aquinas).

SHEPHERD'S CLOSET NEEDS YOUR HELP!


