Baptisms: In order to make baptismal arrangements, parents are required to call the parish office to make an appointment to fill out paperwork and schedule a baptismal class (required of parents and godparents) and a baptismal date.

Marriages: Couples are required to make arrangements with the priest at least six months prior to the date of marriage and attend a marriage preparation program. Contact the parish office to begin this process.

Funeral Arrangements: Should be arranged by family, church and mortuary. Normal Christian burial consists of Vigil Service, Holy Mass and Burial in a Catholic Cemetery. Any other arrangements should first be discussed with parish priest.

As you are reading my thoughts this weekend, I would like to inform you that I am here in the Philippines to attend my Uncle's Funeral and also to spend 12 days of vacation after all the busyness of Christmas. I will be back on the 28th of January. In my absence, Father Conrad will take care of the pastoral and sacramental needs of the parish. The office staff will take care of any business related matters.

I would like to thank all those who have given Christmas donations to our church and to all the Christmas gifts and cash gifts I received from so many parishioners. Thank you for your thoughtfulness and generosity and may God reward you a hundredfold.

FYI: On January 25th, our Bishops in the Bay Area are encouraging us to join the Walk for Life in San Francisco. This walk every year gathers thousands of people from different parishes, Christian denominations and organizations to tell the world of the evil of abortion and to pray that all people, especially leaders of our government, protect human life from its conception until its natural death. Deacon Ken Wedge last weekend formally announced to us of his leave of absence due to a health issue. Let us pray for his complete healing. In his absence, Fr. Jerry Brown, pastor from the Immaculate Heart of Mary, gave his permission to allow his two deacons to help us. Let us welcome Deacon Ron Horan and John Korteum for their YES to serve our parish.

Our parish hall this year received generous donations from two families. We bought a heavy duty scrubber machine to maintain the floor. With the help of this machine, it will be easier to maintain the floor and our hall for rental purposes. I will sit down with our finance council on how we could effectively and efficiently maintain our parish hall due to the increasing demand of renters using our hall and also of different ministries in the parish. I have decided also that the hall is to be made available for funeral receptions this year. There will be no set rental fees, however, a generous donation is encouraged for the use of energy and maintenance. Please call Yvette for more information.

We have hired a new grounds maintenance and landscape person. His responsibilities are to maintain our prayer park and also our Church Property grounds and plants. He will be with us twice a week and on occasion when there are funerals and weddings to clean the church grounds and to pick up litter.

My greatest concern is the prayer park. A big chunk of our ground maintenance budget is being paid for the prayer park maintenance. As most of you know, our prayer park is being maintained by the parish budget since the inactivity of the prayer park committee. I wish that this committee be resurrected in the future. I hope and pray that those who helped before would step up again. This park has been very helpful for me spiritually and for many. I like to walk around the park praying the rosary and doing my other devotions, especially the stations of the cross and the divine mercy chaplet. When I come back from my vacation, we shall set hours of operations for our park. I heard reports that some people without reverence vandalize the park. If state parks and other parks have hours of operation, it is practical and necessary to protect this park and the investment of our donors. This place is meant for praying and not for unruly teenagers and others who make our park a love nest, or a skate board park, or a baseball field or a soccer field, or a "pot session" area.

One of the priorities of the new administration under my leadership is to maintain well and take care of this place, our worship space and properties which were made possible through your generosity and our supportive benefactors.

I have asked Father to share this message with you. I have not been well for most of 2013. I have been tested for many possible diseases but to date the doctors have not been able to determine the cause. After prayer and consultation I have asked Bishop Barber for a medical leave from my duties as deacon at Good Shepherd in order to concentrate on my health issues, and when the cause is determined, my treatment. He has approved my request.

I do not know how long I may be gone. I feel very comfortable knowing you are in the care of Fr. Carl and Fr. Conrad. I ask for your loving support of them both as I worry my absence will cause additional strain on them. I will continue to keep you all in my prayers, and hope that you will keep me in yours. I and my doctors are doing all we can to discover the cause and I am at peace knowing God's will is in control. May the Peace of this season be with you and the Hope a New Year brings be with us all.
