Celebrating Respect Life Month

Full Question: Some people feel that because the Church has no definitive statement on when ensoulment takes place, it is okay to allow abortion and to use early embryos for research. What does the Church say about this?

Answer: The *Declaration on Procured Abortion* states the following:

In the course of history, the Fathers of the Church, her pastors, and her Doctors have taught the same doctrine—the various opinions on the infusion of the spiritual soul did not introduce any doubt about the illicitness of abortion. It is true that in the Middle Ages, when the opinion was generally held that the spiritual soul was not present until after the first few weeks, a distinction was made in the evaluation of the sin and the gravity of penal sanctions. Excellent authors allowed for this first period more lenient case solutions which they rejected for following periods. But it was never denied at that time that procured abortion, even during the first days, was objectively grave fault. This condemnation was in fact unanimous. Most recently, the Second Vatican Council, presided over by Paul VI, has most severely condemned abortion: "Life must be safeguarded with extreme care from conception; abortion and infanticide are abominable crimes." The same Paul VI, speaking on this subject on many occasions, has not been afraid to declare that this teaching of the Church "has not changed and is unchangeable." (7)

Concerning the issue of ensoulment and embryonic stem cell research, *Evangelium Vitae* teaches that even if the presence of a spiritual soul cannot be ascertained by empirical data, the results themselves of scientific research on the human embryo provide a valuable indication for discerning by the use of reason a personal presence at the moment of the first appearance of a human life: How could a human individual not be a human person? (EV 60)

Furthermore, what is at stake is so important that, from the standpoint of moral obligation, the mere probability that a human person is involved would suffice to justify an absolutely clear prohibition of any intervention aimed at killing a human embryo. Precisely for this reason, over and above all scientific debates and those philosophical affirmations to which the Magisterium has not expressly committed itself, the Church has always taught and continues to teach that the result of human procreation, from the first moment of its existence, must be guaranteed that unconditional respect which is morally due to the human being in his or her totality and unity as body and spirit:

The human being is to be respected and treated as a person from the moment of conception; and therefore from that same moment his rights as a person must be recognized, among which in the first place is the inviolable right of every innocent human being to life. (EV 60)

**TODAY WE HIGHLIGHT:
THE HISPANIC MINISTRY**

The Hispanic Ministry unofficially started in January, 2012 following the cancellation of the Spanish Mass here in our parish. With only a handful of faithful members we approached Father Bart when he arrived and asked to work with him. When Father Carl arrived we again presented ourselves to him. After what seemed to be a long struggle and a lot of preparation, in March of this year, 2014, Father Carl officially celebrated our first Mass in Spanish. We felt the Mass in Spanish here at Good Shepherd is a need for the community. Many people, especially the elderly who do not speak English, some of them disabled, do not have their own transport and cannot get to churches farther away from their neighborhood. But the main reason we wanted mass in Spanish was to have this temple to worship our Lord, this sacred place to thank the favors granted, offer our prayers, our love and to grow in numbers our parish family. We wanted to help welcome those of Hispanic descent in the neighborhood. We wanted to help make them feel comfortable and confident that the doors of this church were open to them. The Hispanic Ministry group now has coordinators in fellowship, hospitality, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, baptisms, quinceaneras, weddings, prayer and Youth Formation. We wholeheartedly and collaboratively work with the Ministry Leaders of the parish and are part of the great family of Church of the Good Shepherd. We welcome anyone who would like to work with us. We continue to recruit Spanish speaking ministers into all of the ministries and want to thank those of you who have opened your arms to us, smiled and made us feel welcome and loved. Together with all ministries, our goal is to be One Flock, One Family, Living and Sharing the Love of Christ. Thank you for your attention and please do come by and share a smile and little snack outside.


This drive will support the Lynn Center located right here in Pittsburg.


