An Anniversary Reflection:

For me it starts in the old store in Shopping Heights Lane. A big white open space filled with wooden pews, hanging light fixtures and a gold curtain backdrop. I can remember sitting in the pews next to my parents feeling so small and staring up at the lights and hearing the choir sing. I couldn't actually see the choir so I thought they were all these angelic people behind the gold curtain signing beautiful praises to God. I was 3 years old when the church opened and always wore my best dress and patent leather shoes to church.

I remember Fr. Louie and Fr. Daly greeting the parishioners outside of mass or in the smaller area immediately to the right of the church where we had CCD classes and socials. I was both frightened and in awe of these two men in black. They gave me a respect for vocations. As a small child, the best part was actually after mass. If my brothers and I were quiet, we got to go next-door to the hardware store and get an lcee.

I had no idea this was a temporary worship space until fund raising began for our current church. To me the Church on Shopping Heights Lane was home and that home included Erma Glanzman as the parish secretary, Diane Carpenello as the CCD principal and along with a lot of other CCD teachers whose memories I cherish, was Rose Carpenello who always taught 2nd graders and prepared them for First Holy Communion. We are blessed that Erma and Rose are still involved with us today. Diane has since moved way to be closer to her family.

I attended the first mass in our current sanctuary with my parents in great anticipation of what our future would hold here. I knew this was my new spiritual home when Fr. Louis elevated his new, beautiful purple chalice during the consecration at that first mass. It was one of the first truly recognizable spiritual moments in my life.

My family and I settled in, my brothers and I continued to be catechized in this new place and continued growing in faith because our parents made sure that we were sitting in the pews every Sunday. My parents, Anthony & Lucy, are still sitting in that same spot!

Fr. Louis was our constant and he endeared himself greatly to our community. We also experienced a plethora of associates who brought an added dimension to our community and faith life. We had the Porsche driving, snow skiing priest, the motorcycle driving priest, the priest that wore a black cape, the interior designer priest, the hoarder priest, the priest who made vestments out of any material he could find, including his mother's bathrobe. At least this is how my young mind identified them.

As the years wore on, young people in the parish started to connect, socialize and work with each other. Many people about my age have many fond memories of working crab feeds, eating bbq until our faces were covered in sauce or coming home burnt to a crisp because we spent all day out in the sun with our families at a parish picnic.

I met my husband Freddy at Good Shepherd; His family sat in the pew across from my family week after week. I am proud to say that my mother-in-law, Ann Ripoli, was part of the original Women's Guild, a group that was instrumental in the growth of this parish. Freddy and I got married here, had our reception in the parish hall, our children were catechized and received their sacraments here. We are still part of this parish community and have been involved in CYO, Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, etc. But for the last 31 years, after an invitation from Lucy Gutierrez, one or both of us have been involved in the faith formation of teenagers because along with living out our baptismal call to be Christ for others, we hope we can teach our faith to young people and help them always feel Good Shepherd is their spiritual home.

This is the community that supported my family and held me up in prayer during a very difficult illness and for this I will be ever grateful. Your faith sustained me.

And I am thankful to say that on September 1st of this year, I will celebrate 25 years of faithful service to the people and parish of Good Shepherd. I started out as a Youth Minister. Fr. Louis invited me to serve upon Erma's retirement, Fr. Helmut supported me and helped me grow in my position here, Fr. Carl has given me the opportunity to continue my work and ministry here. I have worked for every priest assigned here and they have all brought something very valuable to this parish and helped us grow in ways we never thought possible, even if it was painful. Yes, there have been some very difficult times, but mostly there have been very wonderful times. I believe that God has put me in this place to do my small part in helping with the day to day "stuff" that keeps the church going but also to be able to work, live and pray with this very special community with long time friends and new ones as we move into a new and exciting future.

I am who I am as a person and as a Catholic because of what this parish has taught and given to me throughout the years. I am blessed to be part of you.
