Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are coming to the very end of the liturgical year. The day is growing shorter, darker and gloomier. In two weeks we will enter the season of Advent preparing for Christmas. The readings also become darker this time of the year. It is all about the end time, the Eschaton, about the four last things that we hold in our faith: Death-Judgment – Heaven and Hell.



It seems everything in this fallen world is determined upon death, and a fear of death. Think a moment about how much of life is death haunted. Somebody says that the key to understand somebody is to ask them what they are afraid of, then you can manipulate them. Why would people fear death? They fear death because they view death as a bad sign, a tragedy and a failure. They don't want to face this tragedy and try to hide it away. Once death is not accepted, life is not welcomed either because the attitudes toward dying determine the attitudes toward living. So if our culture tries to hide death away, then we, Christians, should love it. We are not afraid of it. Rather, we embrace death as our "Beloved Sister" (St. Francis). Yes, death should become our sister, our friend, and our teacher, for it leads us closer to God. He defeats death by his own death and overturns it into life. Death exists for the sake of something higher, the manifestation of the glory of God. Death does not have a final saying, so fear not.

Since we do not know when our time will come, may we live everyday as if it is our last. Now is the time to forgive those age-old grudges. Now is the time to ask forgiveness from others we have hurt. Now is the time to repair broken relationships and talk to those family members and friends with whom we have lost touch. Now is the time to reach out to others in need. Now is the time to be real about our Christian duty. We do not need to wait until our life passes in front of us. We should not wait until tomorrow. Today is the moment. Now is the time!



22. La Palabra tiene en sí una potencialidad que no podemos predecir. El Evangelio habla de una semilla que, una vez sembrada, crece por sí sola también cuando el agricultor duerme (cf. Mc 4,26-29). La Iglesia debe aceptar esa libertad inaferrable de la Palabra, que es eficaz a su manera, y de formas muy diversas que suelen superar nuestras previsiones y romper nuestros esquemas.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Estamos llegando al final del año litúrgico. Cada día se nos hace más corto, más oscuro y sombrío. Dentro de dos semanas entraremos en la temporada de Adviento preparándonos para la Navidad. Las lecturas también se oscurecen en esta época del año. Todo se trata del tiempo final, del Escatón, de las cuatro últimas cosas que tenemos en nuestra fe: La Muerte- El Juicio Final – el Cielo y el Infierno.

Parece que todo en este mundo derrumbado está determinado sobre la muerte, y el miedo en si a la muerte. Piensa un momento acerca de cuánto de la vida es la muerte tenebrosa. Alguien puede decir que la clave para entender a alguien es preguntándole a qué tienes miedo, entonces así puedes manipularlo(a). ¿Por qué la gente teme a la muerte? Temen a la muerte porque ven la muerte como una mala señal, una tragedia y un fracaso. No quieren enfrentar esta tragedia y tratar de ocultarlo. Una vez que no se acepta la muerte, tampoco se da la bienvenida a la vida porque las actitudes hacia la muerte determinan las actitudes hacia la vida. Así que si nuestra cultura trata de esconder a la muerte, entonces nosotros, los Cristianos, debemos amarla. No le tengamos miedo. Más bien, abracemos a la muerte como nuestra "Hermana Amada" (San Francisco). Sí, la muerte debe convertirse en nuestra hermana, en nuestra amiga, y en nuestra maestra, porque nos acerca aún más a Dios. El derrota a la muerte por su propia muerte y la convierte en vida. La muerte existe por el bien de algo más alto, la manifestación de la gloria de Dios. La muerte no tiene un último decir, así que no temas.

Ya que no sabemos cuándo llegará nuestro tiempo, vivamos cada día como si fuera nuestro último. Ahora es el momento de perdonar esos rencores-seculares. Ahora es el momento de pedir perdón a los que hemos herido. Ahora es el momento de reparar las relaciones rotas y hablar con los miembros de la familia y amigos con los que hemos perdido contacto. Ahora es el momento de llegar a los necesitados. Ahora es el momento de ser realistas sobre nuestro deber Cristiano. No necesitamos esperar hasta que nuestra vida pase delante de nosotros. No debemos esperar hasta mañana. Hoy es el momento. ¡Ahora es el momento!
