Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We all want to live good lives. But the fundamental question to ask is how do we do this? We live in the modern society where the philosophy of doing is overemphasized. "We are what we do" they say. But the reality says we can't do good deeds if our being is not good. Meister Eckhart, a great German mystic puts it so well: "*You should bother less about what you want to do, and think more about what you want to be because if your being were good then your works would shine forth brightly.*" That is so true! We can't do good deeds unless our being is good. Jesus in the Gospel of this eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time echoes the same thoughts. He invites us to look at ourselves and cultivate to perfect our being for good tree bears good fruits.

We become this "good tree" by doing the basics well. First, pray, pray well and pray hard. Let our life be centered in prayer. Second, learn our faith. Listen to the Gospels, learn all that God has revealed through the Church, read the teachings of the saints, and learn from other holy people. Third, live a good sacramental life. Go to Mass, celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, understand the grace of your Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage. Know that the Sacraments nourish you in powerful ways and embrace that nourishment with your whole heart.

The readings of this 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time truly set up a tone, leading us to the season of Lent which will begin on this Ash Wednesday, March 6. Lent invites us to go to the desert where there are no cellphones, no distractions; where we ask ourselves fundamental questions: Who am I? What am I here on earth for? What does God want me to do? Lent also calls us to practice three basic pillars of faith: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. To help you enter this Season of Grace well prepared, here is what you need to know about the rules of fasting during Lent.

Rules of Fasting during Lent in the US.

1- Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

2- Every person between the age of 18 and 60 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Real fasting which pleases God means to reach out to the poor, share what we have with those who have not. Real fasting is to do what Jesus once told in the Parable of the Last Judgment: *give food to the hungry, drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, take care of the sick and visit the prisoners.* In other words, real, God-pleasing fasting is a loving outreach through charitable works.

Why 40 days of Lenten fasting? Because Jesus fasted 40 days in the desert. But if we count Lent from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday. It is 46 days. Why so? Because Sundays are not considered days of fasting for it is the Lord's Day. Every Sunday, even Lenten Sundays are easter Sundays when we celebrate the Risen Christ. That's why Jesus said, do not fast when you come to the wedding: "When the bridegroom is with you, there is no need to fast" (Mark 9:2).

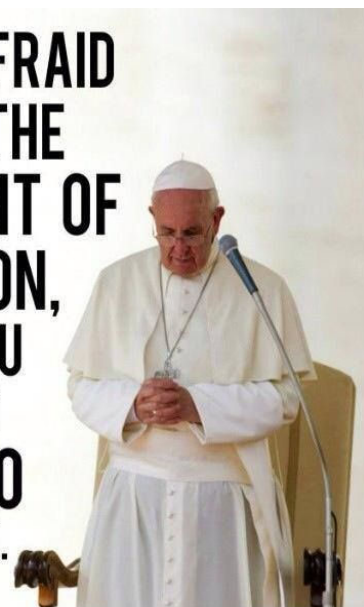

Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Todos queremos vivir buenas vidas. Pero la pregunta fundamental es ¿cómo hacemos esto? Vivimos en una sociedad moderna donde la filosofía de hacer es exagerada. "Somos lo que hacemos", dicen. Pero la realidad dice que no podemos hacer buenas acciones si nuestro ser no es bueno. Meister Eckhart, un gran místico Alemán lo expresa tan bien: "Deberías preocuparte menos por lo que quieres hacer, y pensar más en lo que quieres ser porque si tu ser fuese bueno entonces tus obras brillarían brillantemente". ¡Eso es tan cierto! No podemos hacer buenas acciones a menos que nuestro ser sea bueno. Jesús en el Evangelio de este octavo Domingo del tiempo ordinario hace eco de los mismos pensamientos. Nos invita a mirarnos a nosotros mismos y a cultivar para perfeccionar nuestro ser para que el buen árbol produzca buenos frutos.

Nos convertimos en este "árbol bueno" siguiendo bien los fundamentos. Primero, oramos, oramos bien y fuerte. Que nuestras vidas se centren en la oración. Segundo, aprendamos a conocer nuestra fe. Escuchemos los Evangelios, aprendamos todo lo que Dios ha revelado a través de la Iglesia, leamos las enseñanzas de los Santos y aprendamos de otras gentes Santas. Tercero, vivamos una buena vida sacramental. Vayamos a Misa, celebremos el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, comprendamos el don de la gracia en el Bautismo, Confirmación, Matrimonio. Sepamos que los sacramentos nos alimentan de maneras poderosas y abracemos ese alimento con todo nuestro corazón.

Las lecturas de este octavo Domingo en el tiempo ordinario verdaderamente establecen un tono, que nos lleva a la temporada de Cuaresma que comenzará el Miércoles de Ceniza, el 6 de Marzo. La Cuaresma nos invita a ir al desierto donde no hay teléfonos celulares, no hay distracciones; donde nos preguntamos cuestiones fundamentales: ¿quién soy yo? ¿Por qué estoy aquí en la tierra? ¿Qué quiere Dios que haga? La Cuaresma también nos llama a la práctica de tres pilares básicos de la Fe: la Oración, el Ayuno y Actos de Caridad. Para ayudarles a entrar en esta temporada de gracia bien preparada, aquí está lo que ustedes necesitan saber acerca de las reglas de ayuno durante la Cuaresma.

Reglas de ayuno durante la Cuaresma en los Estados Unidos.

1-cada persona de 14 años de edad o mayor debe abstenerse de la carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, el Viernes Santo y todos los Viernes de Cuaresma.

2-cada persona entre la edad de 18 y 60 debe ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo.

El ayuno real que agrada a Dios significa tender la mano a los pobres, compartir lo que tenemos con los que no lo tienen. El ayuno real es hacer lo que Jesús dijo una vez en la parábola del juicio final: dar comida a los hambrientos, dar de beber a los sedientos, albergar a los desamparados, vestir al desnudo, cuidar de los enfermos y visitar a los encarcelados. En otras palabras, el ayuno real y agradable a Dios es un acercamiento amoroso a través de obras caritativas. **¿Por qué 40 días de ayuno cuaresmal?** Porque Jesús ayunó 40 días en el desierto. Pero si contamos la Cuaresma del Miércoles de Ceniza al Jueves Santo. Son 46 días. ¿Por qué? Porque los Domingos no son días considerados de ayunar por ser el día del Señor. Todos los Domingos, incluso los Domingos Cuaresmales son los Domingos de Pascua cuando celebramos al Cristo resucitado.

Es por eso que Jesús dijo, no ayunes cuando vengas a la Boda: "Cuando el novio está contigo, no hay necesidad de ayunar" (Marcos 9:2).

Thursday, Feb 28th from 7:00pm to 8:30pm

Do you have any plan for your spiritual growth during Lent this year? Come and join us in our Bible study class. Many Catholics don't have habits of reading the Scripture. St Jerome said: "*Ignorance of Scriptures is the ignorance of Christ.*" Truly, we can't fully understand God and his mystery of Incarnation without deeply knowing what He speaks to us through the Scriptures.

So come and join us for an 8 week *Introduction to the Bible class*. The class will be facilitated by Fr. Thi and other core team members. We are going to use the video program called "*Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible*" by Jeff Cavins, one of the best Catholic biblical scholars of our time, who will walk us through key events in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation.

The class meets every Thursday of the month from 7:00pm - 8:30pm, starting Thursday, Feb 28th in the Parish Hall.
