VI Sunday of Easter

Jesus was Jewish, the Apostles were Jews, the first disciples were Jews and Jerusalem was the headquarters of the first Christian community. His inheritance and culture were the Old Testament, Moses, the temple, the Sabbath, the synagogue and the circumcision.

As the church grew through the preaching of the Apostles, the joy and happiness of conversion grew, the love of God and his salvation grew, but problems and differences also grew.

The new Christians had another culture, other rites, other music, they were another world. The new Christians wanted to belong to the new Christ; the new Christians wanted to be sealed with the Spirit of Jesus, not with the spirit of Moses. The new Christians wanted to be part of the new Church of Jesus, not of the old synagogue.

And there they are, in discord and struggle, between the new and the old, between Jews and Gentiles, among the usual ones and newcomers, between Jerusalem and Antioquia.

To resolve the conflict, they go to the authority, to the Apostles and presbyters of the headquarters in Jerusalem. And there it was celebrated what is known as the Jerusalem Council to resolve the conflict between the law of Moses and the faith in Jesus, between the new and the old, between Jews and Gentiles.

The circumcision of the flesh was abolished forever, and the teaching that came out of it was, that we must purify and renew every day our heart with the conversion to Jesus, with a new tradition of respect and acceptance of the new, with the doors of the community and the Church open to all.

All this happened two thousand years ago. And it still happens today in other ways, with other names, with other rites and other realities, among other groups, between Christian churches and within the same community. Brothers and sisters always seek unity in the essentials, unity in what affects the heart of our faith, unity that is based on the love of God.

Christ is essential; He is the foundation of our life and the cornerstone of our community. Let go of what is not essential, let diversity and plurality flourish, let the organ and the guitars, the trumpets of the Mariachis sound, and also the silence; but let us never cease to invoke God the Father, to love Christ and to obey the Holy Spirit.

What better circumcision than the loving presence of God in our hearts? God is love and only my response of love saves me, sanctifies me, redeems me, and makes me a house in which God dwells forever.

The person who loves Jesus, is faithful to him, hears his Word, obeys Him, trusts Him, will experience a living and effective Jesus, where he will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit who is our teacher who accompanies us and guides us in the changes in our lives.



Memorial Day.



VI Domingo de Pascua

Jesús era judío, los apóstoles eran judíos, los primeros discípulos eran judíos y Jerusalén era la sede de la primera comunidad cristiana. Su herencia y su cultura eran el Antiguo Testamento, Moisés, el templo, el sábado, la sinagoga y la circuncisión.

A medida que la iglesia crecía por la predicación de los apóstoles, crecía el gozo y la alegría de la conversión, crecía el amor a Dios y su salvación, pero también crecían los problemas y las diferencias.

Los nuevos cristianos tenían otra cultura, otros ritos, otra música, eran otro mundo. Los nuevos cristianos querían ser de Cristo, los nuevos cristianos querían ser sellados con el Espíritu de Jesús, no con el espíritu de Moisés. Los nuevos cristianos querían ser de la nueva iglesia de Jesús, no de la vieja sinagoga.

Y ahí están, en discordia y lucha, entre lo nuevo y lo antiguo, entre judíos y gentiles, entre los de siempre y los recién llegados, entre Jerusalén y Antioquía.

Para resolver el conflicto acuden a la autoridad, a los apóstoles y presbíteros de la sede central que está en Jerusalén. Y allí se celebró lo que se conoce como el Concilio de Jerusalén para resolver el conflicto entre la ley de Moisés y la fe en Jesús, entre lo nuevo y lo viejo, entre judíos y gentiles.

La circuncisión de la carne quedó abolida para siempre, y la enseñanza que salió de ahí fue, que hay que purificar y renovar cada día nuestro corazón con la conversión a Jesús, con una nueva tradición de respeto y de aceptación de lo nuevo, con las puertas de la comunidad y de la iglesia abiertas para todos.

Todo eso pasó hace dos mil años. Y sigue ocurriendo hoy bajo otras formas, con otros nombres, sobre otros ritos y otras realidades, entre otros grupos, entre iglesias cristianas y dentro de la misma comunidad. Hermanos (as), buscar siempre la unidad en lo esencial, unidad en lo que afecta al corazón de nuestra fe, unidad que sea basada en el amor a Dios.

Lo esencial es Cristo, Él es el fundamento de nuestra vida y la piedra angular de nuestra comunidad; dejemos que lo que no es esencial, dejemos que florezca la diversidad y la pluralidad; dejemos que suene el órgano y las guitarras, las trompetas de los Mariachis y que suene también el silencio; pero no dejemos nunca de invocar a Dios Padre, de amar a Cristo y de obedecer al Espíritu Santo.

¿Qué mejor circuncisión que la presencia amorosa de Dios en nuestro corazón? Dios es amor y sólo mi respuesta de amor me salva, me santifica, me redime, y me hace casa en la que Dios habita para siempre.

El que ama a Jesús, le es fiel, escucha su palabra, le obedece, se fía de Él, va a experimentar a un Jesús vivo y eficaz, donde recibirá el don del Espíritu Santo que es nuestro Maestro que nos acompaña y nos guía en los cambios de nuestra vida.
