**Homily of Pope Francis on the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 2013**

..... The Scripture readings proclaimed to us have as their common theme *the centrality of Christ*. Christ is at the centre, Christ is the centre. Christ is the centre of creation, Christ is the centre of his people and Christ is the centre of history.

1. The apostle Paul, in the second reading, taken from the letter to the Colossians, offers us a profound vision of the centrality of Jesus. He presents Christ to us as *the first-born of all creation*: in him, through him and for him all things were created. He is the centre of all things, he is the beginning: Jesus Christ, the Lord. God has given him the fullness, the totality, so that in him all things might be reconciled (cf. *Col 1:12-20*). He is the Lord of creation, he is the Lord of reconciliation.

This image enables to see that Jesus is the centre of creation; and so the attitude demanded of us as true believers is that of recognizing and accepting in our lives the centrality of Jesus Christ, in our thoughts, in our words and in our works. And so our thoughts will be *Christian* thoughts, thoughts of Christ. Our works will be *Christian* works, works of Christ; and our words will be *Christian* words, words of Christ. But when this centre is lost, when it is replaced by something else, only harm can result for everything around us and for ourselves.

2. Besides being the centre of creation and the centre of reconciliation, Christ is *the centre of the people of God*. Today, he is here in our midst. He is here right now in his word, and he will be here on the altar, alive and present amid us, his people. We see this in the first reading which describes the time when the tribes of Israel came to look for David and anointed him king of Israel before the Lord (cf. *2 Sam 5:1-3*). In searching for an ideal king, the people were seeking God himself: a God who would be close to them, who would accompany them on their journey, who would be a brother to them.


Christ, the descendant of King David, is really *the “brother” around whom God’s people come together*. It is he who cares for his people, for all of us, even at the price of his life. In him we are all one, one people, united with him and sharing a single journey, a single destiny. Only in him, in him as the centre, do we receive our identity as a people.

3. Finally, Christ is *the centre of the history of humanity and also the centre of the history of every individual*. To him we can bring the joys and the hopes, the sorrows and troubles which are part of our lives. When Jesus is the centre, light shines even amid the darkest times of our lives; he gives us hope, as he does to the good thief in today’s Gospel.

Whereas all the others treat Jesus with disdain – “If you are the Christ, the Messiah King, save yourself by coming down from the cross!” – the thief who went astray in his life but now repents, clings to the crucified Jesus and begs him: “Remember me, when you come into your kingdom” (*Lk 23:42*). Jesus promises him: “Today you will be with me in paradise” (v. 43), in his kingdom. Jesus speaks only a word of forgiveness, not of condemnation; whenever anyone finds the courage to ask for this forgiveness, the Lord does not let such a petition go unheard. Today we can all think of our own history, our own journey. Each of us has his or her own history: we think of our mistakes, our sins, our good times and our bleak times. We would do well, each one of us, on this day, to think about our own personal history, to look at Jesus and to keep telling him, sincerely and quietly: “Remember me, Lord, now that you are in your kingdom! Jesus, remember me, because I want to be good, but I just don’t have the strength: I am a sinner, I am a sinner. But remember me, Jesus! You can remember me because you are at the centre, you are truly in your kingdom!” How beautiful this is! Let us all do this today, each one of us in his or her own heart, again and again. “Remember me, Lord, you who are at the centre, you who are in your kingdom”.

Jesus’ promise to the good thief gives us great hope: it tells us that God’s grace is always greater than the prayer which sought it. The Lord always grants more, he is so generous, he always gives more than what he has been asked: you ask him to remember you, and he brings you into his kingdom!

Let us ask the Lord to remember us, in the certainty that by his mercy we will be able to share his glory in paradise. Let us go forward together on this road!

### **Homilía del Papa Francisco en la Solemnidad de nuestro Señor Jesucristo Rey del Universo 2013**

..... Las lecturas bíblicas que se han proclamado tienen como hilo conductor la *centralidad de Cristo*. Cristo está en el centro, Cristo es el centro. Cristo centro de la creación, del pueblo y de la historia.

1. El apóstol Pablo, en la segunda lectura, tomada de la *carta a los Colosenses*, nos ofrece una visión muy profunda de la centralidad de Jesús. Nos lo presenta como el *Primogénito de toda la creación*: en él, por medio de él y en vista de él fueron creadas todas las cosas. Él es el centro de todo, es el principio: Jesucristo, el Señor. Dios le ha dado la plenitud, la totalidad, para que en él todas las cosas sean reconciliadas (cf. 1,12-20). Señor de la creación, Señor de la reconciliación.

Esta imagen nos ayuda a entender que Jesús es el centro de la creación; y así la actitud que se pide al creyente, que quiere ser tal, es la de reconocer y acoger en la vida esta centralidad de Jesucristo, en los pensamientos, las palabras y las obras. Y así nuestros pensamientos serán pensamientos *cristianos*, pensamientos de Cristo. Nuestras obras serán obras *cristianas*, obras de Cristo, nuestras palabras serán palabras *cristianas*, palabras de Cristo. En cambio, La pérdida de este centro, al sustituirlo por otra cosa cualquiera, solo provoca daños, tanto para el ambiente que nos rodea como para el hombre mismo.

2. Además de ser centro de la creación y centro de la reconciliación, Cristo es *centro del pueblo de Dios*. Y precisamente hoy está aquí, en el centro. Ahora está aquí en la Palabra, y estará aquí en el altar, vivo, presente, en medio de nosotros, su pueblo. Nos lo muestra la primera lectura, en la que se habla del día en que las tribus de Israel se acercaron a David y ante el Señor lo ungieron rey sobre todo Israel (cf. 2S 5,1-3). En la búsqueda de la figura ideal del rey, estos hombres buscaban a Dios mismo: un Dios que fuera cercano, que aceptara acompañar al hombre en su camino, que se hiciese hermano suyo.

Cristo, descendiente del rey David, es precisamente el «*hermano*» *alrededor del cual se constituye el pueblo*, que cuida de su pueblo, de todos nosotros, a precio de su vida. En él somos uno; un único pueblo unido a él, compartimos un solo camino, un solo destino. Sólo en él, en él como centro, encontramos la identidad como pueblo.

3. Y, por último, Cristo es *el centro de la historia de la humanidad, y también el centro de la historia de todo hombre*. A él podemos referir las alegrías y las esperanzas, las tristezas y las angustias que entrelazan nuestra vida. Cuando Jesús es el centro, incluso los momentos más oscuros de nuestra existencia se iluminan, y nos da esperanza, como le sucedió al buen ladrón en el Evangelio de hoy.

Mientras todos se dirigen a Jesús con desprecio -«Si tú eres el Cristo, el Mesías Rey, sálvate a ti mismo bajando de la cruz»- aquel hombre, que se ha equivocado en la vida pero se arrepiente, al final se agarra a Jesús crucificado implorando: «Acuérdate de mí cuando llegues a tu reino» (Lc 23,42). Y Jesús le promete: «Hoy estarás conmigo en el paraíso» (v. 43): su Reino. Jesús sólo pronuncia la palabra del perdón, no la de la condena; y cuando el hombre encuentra el valor de pedir este perdón, el Señor no deja de atender una petición como esa. Hoy todos podemos pensar en nuestra historia, nuestro camino. Cada uno de nosotros tiene su historia; cada uno tiene también sus equivocaciones, sus pecados, sus momentos felices y sus momentos tristes. En este día, nos vendrá bien pensar en nuestra historia, y mirar a Jesús, y desde el corazón repetirle a menudo, pero con el corazón, en silencio, cada uno de nosotros: «Acuérdate de mí, Señor, ahora que estás en tu Reino. Jesús, acuérdate de mí, porque yo quiero ser bueno, quiero ser buena, pero me falta la fuerza, no puedo: soy pecador, soy pecadora. Pero, acuérdate de mí, Jesús. Tú puedes acordarte de mí porque tú estás en el centro, tú estás precisamente en tu Reino.» ¡Qué bien! Hagámoslo hoy todos, cada uno en su corazón, muchas veces.

“Acuérdate de mí, Señor, tú que estás en el centro, tú que estás en tu Reino.”

La promesa de Jesús al buen ladrón nos da una gran esperanza: nos dice que la gracia de Dios es siempre más abundante que la plegaria que la ha pedido. El Señor siempre da más, es tan generoso, da siempre más de lo que se le pide: le pides que se acuerde de ti y te lleva a su Reino.

Jesús es el centro de nuestros deseos de gozo y salvación. Vayamos todos juntos por este camino.
