

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It is truly not an exaggeration to say that water is life. We can survive for weeks without food, but we cannot last two or three days without water. Our bodies not only need water, they are water. Medical science reveals that about 60% of the human body is water, while the brain itself is 70% water. Since water is life, the matter of thirst is worthy of our consideration.

The readings of the 3rd Sunday of Lent stand out with the theme of thirst. The first reading from the book of Exodus tells us the Israelites were thirsty in the wilderness. They grumbled they would rather be slaves in Egypt than dying of thirst in the desert. God heard their cries and quenched their thirst. The Gospel presents to us the story of Jesus encountering the Samaritan woman at the well. They were talking about thirst. The Samaritan woman came to the well to get water. Jesus came to meet with her. There occurs an encounter of the two thirsts: God's thirst for man & man's thirst for God.

The woman comes to the well. It means that she thirsts for water. But, probably in the depth of her soul, she may have another thirst. She already had six husbands; but they didn't quench her thirst. Numbers are often significant in Jewish tradition. Six is a number of imperfection and deficiency. Seven, on the other hand, is a number of perfection and sufficiency. Jesus comes to this woman as the seventh man in her life. She found her thirst quenched. The woman's thirst is the image of our soul longing for God's love. Nothing else in this world can ever satisfy this deepest longing of our soul as the Catechism says: "The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself." That's why we always want more and more and we thirst for God.

The story unpacks for us another thirst, which is more true and real than our thirst for God. That's God's thirst for us. It is God who always initiates everything as he said, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you." While hanging on the cross, Jesus said, "I thirst." They gave him some vinegar to drink. But he didn't take it for it was not what he had asked for. He was asking for their souls. So in saying, "Give me a drink" and "I thirst", Jesus was actually thirsting for the love of his own people. He is thirsty for our faith.

The woman's thirst was quenched by her encounter with the Messiah. Jesus' thirst was also quenched by the woman's conversion of heart. What about us? Do we truly feel thirsty for God's love? Are we ready to quench God's thirst with our integrity of hearts? The woman is a symbol of all of us in our concupiscence desire. When we have hooked ourselves in something less than God: money, fame, power, social status, our souls will be ever restless. But if we detach from the vanity of this world, taking refuge in God's loving arms, we will be satisfied. Once we have begun to drink of water of grace, we become like an overflowing fountain offering the same grace to the world.

During this cold and flu season we would like to remind you also that those who are ill are not obligated to attend mass and should stay home to recover.

If you are feeling ill today, please refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace.

HOW TO STAY HEALTHY

1. **Know the Facts:** Influenza is thought to spread mainly person-to-person through coughing or sneezing of infected people.
2. **Take Everyday Actions to Stay Healthy.**
3. **Cover your nose and mouth** with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or into your sleeve if no tissue is available. Throw the tissue away after you use it.
4. **Wash Your Hands Thoroughly and Often** with soap and water. If soap is not available, use an alcohol based hand rub.
5. **Avoid Touching Your Hands, Nose & Mouth.** Germs spread that way.
6. **Stay at Home if You Are Sick.** The CDC recommends you stay home from work or school and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
7. **Get Vaccinated.** Vaccination is the best protection we have against flu.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Realmente no he terminado de decir que el agua es vida. Podemos sobrevivir durante semanas sin comida, pero no podemos durar dos o tres días sin agua. Nuestros cuerpos no sólo necesitan agua, son agua. La ciencia médica revela que alrededor del 60% del cuerpo humano es agua, mientras que el cerebro en sí es 70% agua. Puesto que el agua es vida, la cuestión de la sed es digna de nuestra consideración.

Las lecturas del 3er Domingo de Cuaresma destacan el tema de la sed. La primera lectura del libro del Exodo nos dice que los Israelitas tenían sed en el desierto. Se quejaron de que preferirían ser esclavos en Egipto que morir de sed en el desierto. Dios oyó sus gritos y sació su sed. El Evangelio nos presenta la historia de Jesús encontrando a la mujer Samaritana en el pozo. Hablaban de sed. La mujer Samaritana vino al pozo a buscar agua. Jesús vino a reunirse con ella. Se produce un encuentro de las dos sed: la sed de Dios por la sed del hombre y del hombre por Dios.

La mujer viene al pozo. Significa que tiene sed de agua. Pero, probablemente en la profundidad de su alma, puede tener otra sed. Ella ya tenía seis maridos; pero no saciaron su sed. Los números son a menudo significativos en la tradición Judía. Seis es una serie de imperfecciones y deficiencias. Siete, por otro lado, es una serie de perfección y suficiencia. Jesús viene a esta mujer como el séptimo hombre en su vida. Encontró su sed saciada. La sed de la mujer es la imagen de nuestra alma anhelando el amor de Dios. Nada más en este mundo puede satisfacer jamás este anhelo más profundo de nuestra alma como dice el Catecismo: "El deseo de Dios está escrito en el corazón humano, porque el hombre es creado por Dios y para Dios; y Dios nunca deja de atraer al hombre a sí mismo." Por eso siempre queremos más y más y tenemos sed de Dios.

La historia nos desempaquetá otra sed, que es más verdadera y real que nuestra sed de Dios. Eso es la sed de Dios por nosotros. Es Dios quien siempre inicia todo como él dijo: "No fuiste tú quien me escogió, sino yo quien te escogí a ti." Mientras colgaba de la cruz, Jesús dijo: "Tengo sed." Le dieron vinagre para beber. Pero no lo tomó porque no era lo que había pedido. Estaba pidiendo sus almas. Así que al decir: "Dame un trago" y "tengo sed", Jesús estaba realmente sediento del amor de su propio pueblo. Tiene sed de nuestra fe.

La sed de la mujer fue saciada por su encuentro con el Mesías. La sed de Jesús también fue saciada por la conversión del corazón de la mujer. ¿Qué hay de nosotros? ¿Realmente sentimos sed por el amor de Dios? ¿Estamos listos para saciar la sed de Dios con nuestra integridad de corazón? La mujer es un símbolo de todos nosotros en nuestro deseo de concupiscencia. Cuando nos hayamos enganchado en algo menos que en Dios: dinero, fama, poder, estatus social, nuestras almas estarán siempre inquietas. Pero si nos sepáramos de la vanidad de este mundo, refugiándonos en los brazos amorosos de Dios, estaremos satisfechos. Una vez que hemos comenzado a beber de agua de gracia, y nos convertimos en una fuente desbordante que ofrece la misma gracia al mundo.
