In the gospel of this second Sunday in Ordinary Time, John the Baptist described Jesus twice as the Lamb of God: "*This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world*". For us in the 21st century, these are rather strange words. But to the Jew of the first century it wouldn't have been! In the Old

Testament, when people sinned against God, they slaughtered a lamb as a sacrifice offered to God to atone for their sins. The image of a lamb is also mentioned in the book of revelation chapter 5 when John has a dream that there is a scroll with a special and important message from God, but no one could be found who was powerful enough to open it. But then John hears a voice saying to him: "*Do not weep! See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah has triumphed. He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals.*" When we read this message, we may expect to see a great lion appear. But what we received was not a powerful lion, but a weak and meek lamb.

But this weak Lamb has power to take away the sins of the world. It is to say God's power is displayed in weakness. The world wanted power and God sent a weak, little Baby. They wanted a king and God sent a Savior. They wanted a lion and God sent a Lamb. The world laughed and rejected His gift, as it still does today, but through that Baby the power of life came into existence as the poet, George McDonald, wrote in one of his poems: "*They all were looking for a King to slay their foes, and lift them high; He came a little baby thing, Who made a woman cry.*"

There once was a boy who spent many hours building a model sailboat. When he put it in the local river, however, it moved away from him quickly. He chased it along the bank, but the strong wind and current carried the boat away. The heartbroken boy knew how hard he would have to work to build another sailboat. Downriver, a man found the beautiful boat, took it to town, and sold it to a toy store. Later, the boy was walking through town and noticed the boat in the store window. He explained the situation, but the shopkeeper didn't believe him and said that the only way to get the boat back was to buy it. The boy wanted the sailboat so much that he used his last penny to buy it back. Then he looked at the boat and said: "*Little boat, now you're twice mine: I made you and I bought you.*"

That's what God did for us. We are his twice. He created us and bought us back when we were lost, but instead of paying cash, he paid with his blood - the blood of the Lamb. Today, when we receive the Lamb of God, let's do so from the depths of our hearts, filled with gratitude for his love and with a deep yearning to love him in return.



En el evangelio de este segundo Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario, Juan el Bautista describió a Jesús dos veces como el Cordero de Dios: "Este es el Cordero de Dios, que quita los pecados del mundo". Para nosotros en el siglo 21, estas son palabras bastante extrañas. ¡Pero para el Judío del 1er siglo no habría sido extraño! En el Antiguo Testamento, cuando las personas pecaban contra Dios, masacraban a un cordero como sacrificio ofrecido a Dios para expiar sus pecados. La imagen de un cordero también se menciona en el libro de apocalipsis capítulo 5 cuando Juan tiene el sueño de que hay un pergamo con un mensaje especial e importante de Dios, pero nadie podría ser encontrado que fuera lo suficientemente poderoso para abrirlo. Pero entonces Juan oye una voz que le dice: "¡No llores! El León de la tribu de Judá ha triunfado. Es capaz de abrir el pergamo y sus siete sellos." Cuando leemos este mensaje, podemos esperar ver aparecer un gran león. Pero lo que recibimos no fue un león poderoso, sino un cordero débil y manso.

Pero este Cordero débil tiene poder para quitar los pecados del mundo. Es decir, el poder de Dios se muestra en la debilidad. El mundo quería poder y Dios envió un Bebé débil y pequeño. Querían un rey y Dios envió un Salvador. Querían un león y Dios envió un Cordero. El mundo se rió y rechazó su don, como todavía lo hace hoy en día, pero a través de ese Bebé el poder de la vida surgió como el poeta, George McDonald, escribió en uno de sus poemas: "Todos estaban buscando un rey para matar a sus enemigos, y elevarlos alto; Vino una pequeña cosa de bebé, que hizo llorar a una mujer.

Había una vez un niño que pasó muchas horas construyendo un velero modelo. Cuando lo puso en el río local, el velero se alejó de él rápidamente. Lo persiguió a lo largo de la orilla, pero el fuerte viento y la corriente se llevaron el barco. El chico desconsolado sabía lo duro que tendría que trabajar para construir otro velero. Río abajo, un hombre encontró el hermoso barco, lo llevó a la ciudad y lo vendió a una juguetería. Más tarde, el niño caminaba por la ciudad y se dio cuenta del barco en el escaparate de la tienda. Explicó la situación, pero el tendero no le creyó y dijo que la única manera de recuperar el barco era comprandolo. El chico quería tanto el velero que usó su último centavo para comprarlo de nuevo. Luego miró el barco y dijo: "Pequeño barco, ahora eres dos veces mío: te hice y te compré."

Eso es lo que Dios hizo por nosotros. Somos dos veces de él. Nos creó y nos compró cuando nos perdimos, pero en lugar de pagar en efectivo, pagó con su sangre, la sangre del Cordero. Hoy, cuando recibimos el Cordero de Dios, hagámoslo desde lo más profundo de nuestro corazón, lleno de gratitud por su amor y con un profundo anhelo de amarlo a cambio.


