



"I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life," Jesus tells his disciples in this Fifth Sunday's gospel. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, trust in Me" (Jn 14,1).

The Lord uttered these words at the Last Supper, the eve of his darkest hour. And yet, despite knowing that the worst was about to occur, Jesus calmly declared: "Don't worry. Trust in God, trust in Me."

Christ's words are, of course, very consoling and reassuring. But for many of us humans, they don't strike us as reassuring. We may even dismiss them as unrealistic. How can Jesus assure me not to be troubled when I don't know where to get money in this time of crisis? Or when I have this life-threatening sickness? Or when I am positive for the corona virus? Or when I have to face again the risk of being infected of this deadly virus at work? Or where can I find a job after this crisis? Or how can I feed my family in these difficult times?

We find an easy identification with the disciples today in the Gospel. Like us, they too sometimes have been misdirected, confused, anxious and worrisome of what will happen. Lord, how can we know the way? To whom shall we go? How many times we hear ourselves saying the same thing?

Despite all this, Christ exhorts us that we must never lose faith.

The Gospel teaches us today that in the midst of confusion and misdirection in our lives, even if we sometimes get lost, and misled, get tired and even give up, Jesus is always there to be our way and our life. He is the answer to our confusions, doubts and anxieties. The solution to our doubts, problems and troubles is to submit ourselves to Jesus' ways and to His will. He is the answer to our difficulties. He is the right direction in life.

At this time of crisis, we need Jesus all the more in our lives. Hold on to our faith and believe that He will always be there for us no matter what. Trust in His love and mercy with unwavering hope that He will deliver us from this pandemic very soon.

May we find direction in Jesus and if we ever are misled and misdirected, may we always find ourselves back to Him for He is the way, the truth and the life.



"Yo soy el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida", dice Jesús a sus discípulos en el evangelio de este Quinto Domingo. "No dejen que sus corazones se afligan. Confien en Dios, confien en Mí" (Juan 14,1).

El Señor pronunció estas palabras en la Última Cena, la víspera de su hora más oscura. Y sin embargo, a pesar de saber que lo peor estaba a punto de ocurrir, Jesús declaró con calma: "No te preocunes. Confía en Dios, confía en Mí."

Las palabras de Cristo son, por supuesto, muy consoladoras y tranquilizadoras. Pero para muchos de nosotros los humanos, no nos parecen tranquilizantes. Incluso podemos descartarlas como poco realistas. ¿Cómo puede Jesús asegurarme que no me preocupe cuando no sé dónde conseguir dinero en estos tiempos de crisis? ¿O cuando tengo una enfermedad que pone en peligro mi vida? ¿O cuando me han confirmado que tengo el coronavirus? ¿O cuando tengo que enfrentarme de nuevo al riesgo de estar infectado de este virus temible una vez al regresar al trabajo? ¿O dónde puedo encontrar un trabajo después de esta crisis? ¿O cómo puedo alimentar a mi familia en estos tiempos difíciles?

Hoy encontramos en el Evangelio una identificación fácil y similar con los discípulos. Al igual que nosotros, ellos también a veces han sido mal dirigidos, han estado confundidos, ansiosos y muy preocupados de lo que sucederá. Señor, ¿cómo podemos saber el camino? ¿A quién iremos? ¿Cuántas veces nos oímos decir lo mismo?

A pesar de todo esto, Cristo nos exhorta a que nunca debemos perder la fe.

El Evangelio de hoy nos enseña que en medio de confusiones y desorientaciones en nuestras vidas, aunque a veces nos perdamos, nos engañemos, nos cansamos e incluso nos rindamos, Jesús siempre está ahí para ser nuestro camino y nuestra vida. El es la respuesta a nuestras confusiones, dudas y ansiedades. La solución a nuestras dudas, problemas y dificultades es someternos a los caminos de Jesús y a su voluntad. Es la respuesta a nuestras dificultades. Es la dirección correcta en la vida.

En este momento de crisis, más necesitamos a Jesús en nuestras vidas. Aferrarnos a nuestra fe y creer que siempre estará allí para nosotros sin importar lo que pase. Confía en su amor y misericordia con la esperanza inquebrantable de que nos librará de esta pandemia muy pronto.

Que encontremos dirección en Jesús y si alguna vez somos engañados y mal dirigidos, que siempre nos encontremos de regreso en su presencia, porque El es el camino, la verdad y la vida.

Happy Mother's Day

We often feel overwhelmed with celebrations in May. In May we honor Our Lady with the Rosary processions; we celebrate our Good Shepherd Feast Day; we celebrate Mother's Day; we feast on Cinco de Mayo, Graduations, First Holy Communions, Confirmations, etc. This May of 2020 comes with a different tone. It is a little quiet due to the coronavirus. The pandemic has shut down our parties for our mothers. But it can't lockdown our expressions of love and gratitude for them.

Last week we celebrated our Good Shepherd Feast Day. We reflected on the image of the Good Shepherd. This image first appears to us as a masculine character so we don't often hear people compare mothers to shepherds, but in fact they are shepherds. The life of shepherds is very hard. The shepherd is never off duty guarding the flock against wild animals, thieves and robbers. That's what mothers do for us.

People often wonder what authentic love looks like. Well, just look at a mother. She gives her blood during a pregnancy. She gives her milk after the child is born. She gives her sleep for the first two years; she gives immense amounts of her time and her sweat and her attention to her child. Authentic love does not look much like what we see on television. It looks a lot more like what we see in mothers. That's why even God takes a mother's love as a model of what love is for us. Isaiah 66:13 says: "*As a mother comforts her son, so will I comfort you.*"

My dear friends, let's reflect on how much our moms do and sacrifice for us in our lives. So on this Mother's Day, let us thank God for giving us our mothers. Let us praise them, honor them and bless them. We lift them up to the Lord and we pray:

We thank you Lord for our mothers. We thank you that she gave us life and nurtured us all these years. She gave us the gift of faith, helping us to know You and to know Jesus and His ways. She taught us how to love and how to sacrifice for others. She taught us that it was okay to cry and that we should always tell the truth.

Bless her with the graces she needs and which you want to give her today. Help her to feel precious in your eyes today and to know that we love her. Give her strength and courage, compassion and peace. Bless her this day with your love. Amen!
